From Fr. Doug's Desk...

Our Parish Prepares for the Synod

What is a synod? It's an assembly of the clergy and sometimes also the laity in a diocese or other division of a particular Church. Pope Francis has asked each diocese to have listening sessions. This is our diocesan timeline.

Sept 2021 Form the diocesan synodal team and begin the planning process

Oct 2021 Develop listening process, leader's guide & materials

Nov 2021 Conduct facilitator training to prepare the People of God. Conduct listening sessions during Advent.

Jan 2022 Consult with other Christians during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (Jan 18-25) and collect summaries from consultations

Feb 2022 Draft diocesan working document Mar 2022 Hold a diocesan pre-synodal gathering in early March. Submit the diocesan 10 page synthesis to USCCB.

This is a chance to unearth one's personal feelings about the church. What do you envision for the church? If you had five minutes with the pope, what would you ask him to change? What would you affirm? Here are some thoughts I hear from the Catholics I know in and out of the parish.

Can we have more Latin Masses? Less talk about abortion, more talk about climate change, causes of poverty. The Vatican structure has to go. Jesus wouldn't recognize this massive rich institution as His church. Keep the creed, but every diocese decide the specifics of how to be Catholic after that.

Make birth control not be a sin. No one confesses it anyway.

The March for Life in Washington is okay, but when is the March against Racism in Selma going to take place?

How about a part time priest so my parish can have a pastor? Bring back Liturgical dance.

"And also with you"

Can we have one hymnal publisher? In this age of technology, hymnals could be custom made for each parish.

Have the assembly bless gay marriages, if the priest can't, the congregation can do it.

May we please use inclusive language: "for us vs for us men", "brothers and sisters vs brothers" "Father Son and Spirit vs Loving liberating and life-giving God"

The Episcopalians follow Jesus and use the same bible as us. They also have women priests, gay married priests, and hetero married priests. Why can't we?

"Why should I leave the church, let the bishops leave the church."

If lay people can baptize, let them hear confessions and anoint the sick.

Get out of the marriage business. Divorced people have suffered enough. Just call a bad marriage a mistake and move on. Allow divorced people to remarry and receive the sacraments. That's what they're doing in Germany.

Preaching is terrible.

Close all the Catholic schools. They are a waste of money.

How about the US bishops issue a document on gluttony, diabetes and obesity. Are there any fat bishops around?

Some of the best parents I know are LGBTQ parents who have adopted.

There is way too much emphasis on Mary. Catholics worship her.

"I saw the movie Rebel Hearts". Like the IHM nuns, we need some rebel bishops too, starting with a change in their outfits.

Why is the selection of bishops a big secret? At least let the local clergy pick the new bishop. Why can't the parish council interview and pick the new pastor? That's kind of what they did in the early church.

Have the next USCCB gathering in El Paso, Texas across from Mexico. It's cheaper than meeting in DC and you can call attention to the refugees imprisoned on the border while you visit.

Our listening session will be in December.
