OUR MISSION STATEMENT





From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Happy New Year

2022 is upon us. Happy New Year! May this year bring you peace, joy and good health. For our country and our planet, may we find our way.

A year ago today I was in Fairview Hospital ICU. I've never shared the whole story with you.

I had tested negative for COVID a week earlier but when my doctor, John Gerace, called to see how I was doing, he could hear my labored breathing over the phone. He came to the rectory and drove me to the hospital. Is he the best doctor ever?

I was diagnosed with COVID pneumonia and admitted. They took me to Parkview Rm22. I was there for about two hours when the infectious disease specialist came in and said they were transferring me to ICU. I had an oxygen mask but they really wanted to intubate me. I refused. The specialist even called my sister and told her to tell me to get intubated. No luck there either.

Anyway, I was started on the usual treatment: five days of Remdesivir and steroids, accompanied by various other drugs that prevent blood clots, lower blood pressure and a bunch of other stuff I don't remember. My pulse ox was 84 without oxygen. I could only say two or three words without having to take a deep breath. Even the slightest movement drained my oxygen and caused stress, hence no texts and no phone calls. Only my one sister was allowed to call.

I received the best of care from all the nurses. Hungarian Kathy and Black Robert stood out as two of the most compassionate nurses I have ever met. They gave me a will to live.

After the five days of treatment with Remdesivir and steroids, there was absolutely no change. The doctors did not know how to proceed.

The next morning, something very strange happened. I was dying. I could feel my life force slowly leaving my body. It was a weird feeling. I was not scared, but more in shock. I kept thinking to myself "I can't believe this is happening." My body felt like it was running out of gas. Slowly rolling to a stop.

While my soul was leaving my body, there was

this wonderful sensation. I have lived in the West Park area of Cleveland for over 25 years. I know many employees at the hospital. It seemed like everyone in the neighborhood and beyond knew I was there and was praying for me. And I could feel the power of those prayers! I could almost taste them. They were tangible, palpable. And those prayers were pulling my soul back into my body. It was as if a battle for my life was going on. The prayers won. It was one of the most powerful and emotional events of my life.

I'm not sure what the monitors showed when all this was going down, but I'd love to find out.

Anyway, that afternoon Dr. Bhalla came into my room. She said they were going to try five more days of Remdesivir and steroids. She did not seem particularly hopeful, but I think she realized a lot of people had their eye on me. Plus, there was no other option. On the third day of the second round of drugs, my ninth day in ICU, Dr. Bhalla entered my room excited. I could tell something had changed. She seemed to be walking on air. "I think you have turned the corner" she said. She was right. I began to get better each day. I owe her my life too.

As you know, I was released eight days later. I recouped at home with oxygen. Eventually I could say Mass sitting down with my portable tank. You know the rest. I have some mild residual effects now, mostly just getting short of breath if I exert myself.

So, the moral of the story is this: I should be dead. I'm not. It's the beginning of a new year. Why am I still here? What does God have in mind for me this year? Help me find out. Your prayers are the reason I am still here. Come to the "What's On Your Mind/Synod" listening sessions and share your hopes and dreams for our church.

Why are you still here? What does God have in store for you this new year? What plan do you have to put God's dream for you into action?

When gardening resumes in April, I know I will complain about a sore back and creaky joints. That doesn't mean I'm not grateful to be alive. It just means I'll be 70 this year. Prayer is powerful. It makes a difference. Thank you again for yours.


