



From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Synod on Synodality/What's On Your Mind

Last night we held our first gathering for the synod on synodality. It will take me a while to put all the comments into some cohesive whole to submit to the bishop. There were definitely some recurring themes throughout the evening.

About 45 people attended the first session. At least half of them had joined the parish within the last two years, many within the last year. Unless you are a part of the welcoming committee, many did not know that. We used to have a Meet the Staff Gathering twice a year. Now we could be doing them six times a year. Blessed Trinity is a "destination" parish meaning that many people drive some distance to get here. They pass quite a few churches before they arrive. What they seek is what we have to offer: a strong sense of social justice, social awareness and social action, inclusion, welcome, full, conscious and active liturgical participation, beautiful music and homilies that connect the Gospel with daily living. All of that is based on a strong prayer life and biblical discipleship.

Some referred to our parish as an island. They said it's sad that there aren't more parishes like ours around.

Those in attendance encouraged people to get involved in the life of the parish. Some people talked about the value of their small groups and intentional communities. Others mentioned great material needs that will be affecting people and how participation in the St. Vincent de Paul Society is needed. There is a sense of ownership in our parish.

Blessed Trinity's mission touches the neighborhood. We work hand in hand with the Food Bank, the Hunger Network, Bellaire Puritas Development Corporation, Ecumenical Prayer Services, homeless Jesus, witness for racial harmony, and now "mittens on the line" by the bus stop.

Regarding the diocese, the topic of the seminary and what it is producing came up frequently. Let's just say that a vast majority are concerned about it; from the relatively recent ordination of sexual predators (yes, plural) to young men parading around in cassocks, citing the catechism and sin.

Regarding the universal church, there seems to be a battle between Pope Francis who is very popular in our parish and members of the curia. The (lack of a) role of women came up frequently. Let women preach, ordain women deacons, ordain women as priests. Let women head various departments in the church. Let women have decision making power.

Some of my favorite quotes from the evening are:

"The Catholic Church has more rules than God."

"We are disciples first and Catholics second."

"Time is running out. Be bold."

"There is so much brilliance in our parish, especially among the women religious who attend here."

"Find ways to keep people in instead of looking for ways to kick them out."

"I'm scared for the future of our church".

"Our leadership has lost credibility since the sex abuse crisis."

There were some suggestions as to how to help our parish move forward. Those included more opportunities for women preaching, adult education, reaching out to the youth (and the blind), better marketing and publicity.

All in all, it was a fantastic evening. I'm sure the second session will be too.
