OUR MISSION STATEMENT



FROM FR. DOUG'S DESK



From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Ordinary Time

We are back in what is liturgically known as Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time provides an opportunity to reflect on our baptismal call and response. Each week we are given opportunities to look at how Jesus related to people and to mirror his example. We are also in Cycle C, which relies heavily on the Gospel of St. Luke. Luke emphasizes the role of the Spirit, the preferential option for the poor and marginalized, the role of women, the importance of prayer and the joy of discipleship. We will hear those themes repeatedly throughout this year.

A change of liturgical season means a change in our worship environment. Gone are the crib, the poinsettias and the trees. Green has replaced white as the liturgical color. A new musical setting for Mass responses and for the Eucharistic Prayer helps us feel that we are in a new season.

This new season gives me an opportunity to reflect on our communal prayer. Our prayer requires everyone's participation. We participate by "doing what we are all supposed to be doing". It only takes one person to lessen or sometimes ruin our liturgical prayer. Think of that call to silent prayer before Mass. When one or two people keep talking, then there is no silence. When we are asked to sing and pray the hymns, we ALL need to take out those hymnals and pray. And if we are selling items after Mass, give the sellers a chance to stay for the sending forth hymn before they go and do their ministry. You can wait those 30 seconds.

It's real obvious when we have visitors. I'm afraid it reflects what is going on in other parishes. Visitors sometimes come late, leave

early, and don't take out a hymnal. And these are the people who've made an effort to come to church even though they are out of town!

Along that same theme, I have asked the ushers to be engaged in the petitions and not "get ready" for the collection. They are entitled to pray for our intentions, and we need them to be doing what we are all doing.

Musically we tried to make the Mass one cohesive whole. Beginning this week we will be using the Mass of Angels and Saints. It provides the ultimate in flexibility, while retaining a wonderful musical unity that enables our assembly to sing it with ease. The composer, Steven Janco, understands that the Mass is a cohesive whole. His music reflects that, from the penitential rite to the preface dialogue to acclamations throughout the Eucharistic Prayer to the Lamb of God.

The Eucharistic prayer has six parts, the last of which are the petitions. This is where we pray for our pope, our bishop, for ourselves and those who have gone before us. We use the same musical setting and response to connect these petitions to the universal prayer that concluded the liturgy of the word.

Well done liturgy requires work. I am grateful to Sonia who makes sure that everyone, choir, cantor and me, is prepared ahead of time. When we have these changes, Sonia and I make sure that we practice them and become familiar with the praying of it and not just hitting the right notes. There is a difference. She makes sure I do it right. We are blessed to have her.

So it may be called Ordinary Time but it is anything but ordinary. Each week is a new beginning in Christ.
