OUR MISSION STATEMENT



From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Why Now?

In last Sunday's Gospel, Jesus admits that there are evil men in the world. By their fruits you will know who is good and who is bad.

This past week, Vladimir Putin revealed himself again as the sociopathic, pathological liar, murderer and war criminal that he has always been. He has no regard for international law. He respects no country's borders. He attacks the media. He disseminates lies in his own country. When there is an opposition leader, he locks them up. He threatens nuclear war. Talk of him being unhinged is redundant since that is what sociopathy is.

The problem is that he has been doing this for over twenty years. In 2008 he invaded and took over Georgia. (It is alleged that Marjorie Taylor Greene said, "Too bad he didn't capture the radical left socialist city of Atlanta while he was here.") In 2014 he invaded and took over Crimea. There is one reason he has gotten away with it - money. International banks, US banks, NATO allies did not want to risk the loss of money, the cost of gas and the risk of war. And so, they let the evil one run free. Now we see what happens when good people sit by and do nothing. Or can we call them good at this point.

By the way, there is an important history here. Between 1932 and 1933, Stalin starved somewhere between four and seven million Ukrainians to death.

Jimmy Carter had a foreign policy based on linkage. He combined foreign policy with a nation's record on human rights. He punished nations who abused their citizens. That cost capitalists money and big business didn't like that. He was booted out of office after one term.

What countries, banks, states, companies and wealthy citizens are doing now to squeeze

Putin and his corrupt oligarchs could have and should have been done years ago, not for good politics but for the sake of the Gospel. Citizens in Georgia and Crimea lost their freedom. The Russian population has suffered the greatest gap between rich and poor in the modern world.

There are other brutal dictators in the world. They may not be as sociopathic as Putin but they are as evil. Ethnic cleansing and murders occur in China. Myanmar, Saudi Arabia, Congo, Syria. Only toward North Korea has there been an international isolation. The Gospel must be applied evenly wherever God's children suffer. Otherwise, it is not the Gospel. It is expediency for profit.

Putin will feel the heat for this invasion and so will we. We have seen what the Ukrainian people are willing to sacrifice. How about you? I'm ready to pay \$5 a gallon for gas if it will help Ukraine. You and I have not been asked for much. What are you willing to risk for the sake of the Gospel?

Those who think religion has nothing to do with politics don't know a thing about religion. Here is a glaring example of what happens when a ruler abuses, starves and arrests the children of God for no reason. Jesus would not sit by idly and neither should we. If we are going to follow Him, we have to take up our cross daily. Maybe that means forgiving those who hurt us. Maybe it means paying \$5 a gallon for gas.

This didn't have to happen. He lies, he cheats, he attacks those who speak the truth only to satisfy his hunger for self-love. But this is what happens when a sociopath, a pathological liar, a man who has lost touch with reality is allowed to run free without repercussions. Like an infection or a cancer, this kind of man must be eradicated early on before he spreads and grows and becomes deadly. Let us be wary of what any autocrat could do.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE - Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat for all who have reached their 14th year. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence. Fasting is for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year. Fasting requires having only one full meal for the day. Two smaller meals may be taken, but together they should not equal one full meal.
