



# From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Do You Want to be Holy?

Today, Palm Sunday, begins Holy Week. It is not the week that is holy. It is us, who are invited to be holy. This only happens if we participate in the solemn celebration of this holy week. Come to these services. These are the three high holy days of Holy Week.

Holy Thursday is all about the Eucharist as service. Some would have you believe that it is the day that Christ instituted the sacrament of Holy Orders. That is not true. Jesus never ordained anyone.

I remember as a kid hearing that Jesus and the 12 Apostles celebrated the Last Supper. Then he made everyone present a priest. Well, now we know that it was not the Apostles who gathered at the Last Supper. According to the bible, it was the disciples, a much larger inclusive group. We still affirm this at Mass, "He broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying..."

There were perhaps 40 or 50 people gathered at the Last Supper, men, women and children. It was the Passover feast, a family celebration, where neighbors were also invited to share in the Paschal Lamb. No one was to be excluded and no one was to be alone. The message was clear. This Supper is about the call to discipleship and service. That is why Jesus washes the feet of his disciples (Again, not Apostles).

This new commandment to "love one another" went far beyond the Jewish belief that they and only they were God's chosen people. God has chosen us all and we are to love and serve one another.

In our parish, as in many parishes, we are restoring the Eucharistic ritual of washing each other's feet now that the immediate dangers of COVID have passed. Participation in this part of the service is optional but encouraged. On Holy Thursday come and have your feet washed and then wash another person's feet.

Easily removable shoes or sandals may be in order, but not a requirement.

On Good Friday we celebrate that "Jesus practices what he preaches". He shows the path of non-violence as the only true way to live. He turns the other cheek, he forgives those who persecute him, he pardons his killers. Jesus was not a big fan of our second amendment. That is why most countries don't have a similar "right" in their constitution. It is contrary to the Gospel and counter Christian. On Good Friday, we venerate the cross, not as an instrument of torture, but as a symbol of the non-violence we are all called to accept.

The liturgy of the Easter vigil is the high point of the liturgical year. It has four parts, the celebration of light, the liturgy of the word, the liturgy of baptism and the liturgy of the Eucharist. Everyone should be there.

The Easter vigil begins outside with a bonfire. The priest says, "Dear brothers and sisters, on this most sacred night in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed over from death to life, the Church calls upon her sons and daughters, scattered throughout the world, to come together to watch and pray".

"If we keep the memorial of the Lord's paschal solemnity in this way, listening to his word and celebrating his mysteries, then we shall have the sure hope of sharing his triumph over death and living with him in God".

Then the Priest blesses the fire, saying:

"O God, who through your Son bestowed upon the faithful the fire of your glory, sanctify this new fire, and grant that, by these paschal celebrations, we may be so inflamed with heavenly desires, that with minds made pure we may attain festivities of unending splendor. Through Christ our Lord. Amen."

Then the Paschal candle is lit, the Exultet is sung, we recall the history of our salvation and oh heck,... there is so much more. Just come to the Easter vigil and be moved by the beauty of how we pray and the rituals we do. And let us be present to welcome LJ who is to be baptized into our community of faith.
