From the Desk of Fr. Doug

IDCC

Last week I met with representatives of The Identification Crisis Collaborative (IDCC). It was started in 1997 as a program of St. Colman Church's Outreach Ministry in response to a growing need for identification documents and ID assistance. Blessed Trinity will be their newest location.

The first IDCC sites were St. Colman, West Side Catholic Center, the Men's Shelter on Lakeside, and the Women's Shelter then on E. 18 Street; these sites were chosen to ensure that people in need of help with identification documents did not have to travel far to get them. Adding new sites, when funding allows, has this same goal.

The IDCC provides people's own birth certificates and State IDs and replacement/ renewal Driver's licenses for people with very low income who cannot afford them or obtain them on their own. Some documents, like out of state Birth Certificates, are very difficult to obtain. These Birth Certificates can cost from \$15 to \$60 depending on where you are born. Ohio Birth certificates are \$25 each; IDs are \$10 and replacement Drivers Licenses are \$28 or so. And if an entire family needs to provide these documents for utility assistance or for applications for housing, etc., it is beyond their ability and prevents them from moving forward, especially if they are homeless or jobless.

Being without an ID is one of the first obstacles an individual or family faces in trying to get back on their feet. Without an ID and/ or a certified Birth Certificate, a person cannot work, obtain medical care, go to school, enroll in college or post high school training, get a GED, get housing, or even get a library card or register to vote or get a disability pass from RTA without an ID.

We serve people whose annual income qualifies them for Food Stamps/SNAP, which is about \$15000/year for an individual adult.

IDCC services are located at 30+ sites around the county, where people who may need this assistance already frequent such as shelters, rehab facilities, pantries, and outreach centers around the county. The IDCC trains staff and volunteers at its sites to guide people in getting the documents they need and to pay for them with IDCC funds. Current funders include the ADAMHS Board, Cuyahoga County, the Community West Foundation, and individual donors.

Every year, IDCC provides between 8000 and 10000 identification documents and IDs, replacement, and renewal Drivers licenses and CDLs to eligible residents of Cuyahoga County.

We are looking for disciples who might be interested in this labor of love. It is thought that we would do this twice a week while the Bountiful Basement is open. That would give potential recipients a morning and an evening time to participate, although morning seems to be more popular across the county.

So, all of you who have expressed your regret that you cannot pull weeds because your knees are bad and your bones ache, here is something you can do.
