#### **OUR MISSION STATEMENT**





#### FROM FR. DOUG'S DESK



### From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Recently, I was asked to give a presentation next year to a group of ladies. Because of a conflict, I had to decline. Then the person who invited me to speak asked if I could recommend another priest who believes in Vatican II "because there are so few of you". She is correct in her assessment of the situation of course.

I belong to a priest group. We gather for lunch, discussion and updating about news in the diocese. The youngest is 63. We refer to ourselves as Vatican II clergy. All priests are welcome, but there is no great rush to join, especially among the younger priests, one of whom told me "we're just waiting for you guys (Vatican II priests) to die".

This reflects an interesting situation in our church. Left and Right agree that the church is a mess. Those on the left are the minority, and most are over 60, but there are any number of recent books that explain their take on the church today. There's The Great Spiritual Migration by Brian McLaren, Honest Rituals, Honest Sacraments by Joseph Martos, Repair My House by Michael Crosby, An Unorthodox Faith by Kurt Struckmeyer or James Carroll's The Truth at the Heart of the Lie, how the Catholic Church Lost Its Soul. All of these books speak of the need for reform in our church – to embrace dialogue, the role of women, collaboration, modern culture, science, new ways of envisioning things, the preferential option for the poor and marginalized and returning to the teachings of Jesus. These are concepts fleshed out in the Documents of Vatican II, particularly the document, Lumen Gentium, the church in the modern world. By the way, all of these books can be found in our library and are here for your reading enjoyment.

The Right also agrees that the church is a mess, but they attribute the decline in the church to a lack of discipline and following church laws. "If only we could go back to the good old days when Catholics obeyed" seems

to be their mantra. It is found not just in a desire to return to the Mass in Latin, but in a rejection of Vatican II as well. The source of sin in the world is the secular world itself. Modern culture is pagan and anti-Christian. To fix this, the right says that what we need is clarity of orthodoxy. "This is who we are, this is what we believe and if you don't like it you can leave the church". Bishop Michael Olson of Dallas is an example of that. The culturewarrior bishop recently and wrongly said that the values of "Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion" are "truly hostile to the principles of the Gospel of Jesus Christ". Yikes! There is a great emphasis on sin, punishment, hell and damnation, and fear that comes from the Right.

The problem with the approach of the right is that we tried this already. This was the modus operandi of John Paul II and Benedict XVI. Both of them were rigid legalists and expressed a desire for a true church, even if that meant that it be a smaller, but purer church. They appointed bishops who had to pass a litmus test of orthodoxy, for example, no discussion of women's ordination. During their papacies, participation in Sunday worship sank to record lows throughout the world. In Europe it is almost non-existent. In the US it's down to 12%.

In the last two years we have had a large number of people, young and old, join our parish. They are looking for a Vatican II parish and they like what they see here. We have a strong social justice program. We have full, active participation in the liturgy. No one comes late for Mass and no one leaves early. We are diverse and we welcome diversity. We emphasize continued Catholic education for adults and provide educational and spiritual growth opportunities. They tell me that there just aren't many other parishes like ours out there. That's good for our growth but sad for our universal church. Let's enjoy what we have and let us build the city of God.
