#### **OUR MISSION STATEMENT**



## From the Desk of Fr. Doug

#### It's never too late to learn

When I was in the seminary, everyone had to have the Jerome Biblical Commentary. It was a thick book that contained all the latest developments and studies about the bible. When it was first published, it was the first of a kind. Less than 25 years later in the early 1990s, The New Jerome Biblical Commentary was published. The very first sentence of the forward of that edition reads "This comprehensive commentary on the Bible now reappears in a form about two-thirds new." That is a lot of relearning I had to do. I still have to update myself in many fields.

Advances in archeology, linguistics, sar-cophagi, biblical studies, sociology, anthropology and other disciples have shed new light on many bible passages. People in my generation grew up thinking that the bible was written in order, first Genesis, and then Exodus and down the line. We thought that the first book written in the New Testament was the Gospel of Matthew, followed by the Gospel of Mark, then Luke then John and the letters of St. Paul were writeen. Today we know differently. So much has changed.

There have been tremendous strides in what we call systematic theology as well. Systematic theology is a form of theology in which the aim is to arrange religious truths in a self-consistent whole. Much of what I learned used "natural law", science and the philosophy of Aristotle as a framework for arranging these truths. But we know that natural law – what nature teaches us about reality – is understood so differently than it was centuries ago. For example, people who

were left-handed were considered abnormal, even inherently disordered. (The Latin word for left handed is 'sinister'!) Today we know that being born left-handed is as normal as being born with two eyes. Understandings about gender and sexual identity are evolving as well, from toxic masculinity to binary sexuality.

The James Webb Space telescope has revealed a universe far beyond anyone's comprehension, including the author of Genesis who thought that the stars were lights that hung from a giant dome in the sky or that rains came from flood gates in that dome that opened and closed.

Aristotelian philosophy has given way to process theology, the theology of becoming, the cosmic Christ and the openness to what other religions have to offer.

If you have not taken the time to learn more about our faith and how our understanding of the world we live in affects what we believe, it's never too late to learn. (EWTN will not make you current or knowledgeable. It will take you back to the 50s) There are many modern books by contemporary authors in our library that are yours to borrow for free. Every Tuesday in September we will be having an adult education series, dealing with a variety of contemporary topics from what does it mean to be church to what is a normal body to whose job is it anyway?

Whether you come to hear these fabulous speakers or whether you choose to keep yourself current about our faith in other ways, the important thing is that you do it!
