

From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Cake Baking and the Eucharistic Prayer

If I have two eggs, some flour, sugar, butter, milk and a pinch of salt, what do I have? Ingredients. If I mix them together I have batter. If I bake them, then and only then do I have a cake. i.e, after the whole process is finished.

Like cake baking, "the Eucharistic Prayer is a single liturgical act, consisting of several parts: an introductory dialogue, the preface, the Holy, Holy, the calling down of the Holy Spirit (epiclesis), the institution narrative, the Memorial Acclamation, the anamnesis, (memory of Christ's death and Resurrection) the intercessions, and the doxology with its Amen." (*Sing to the Lord #117*)

The document, Sing to the Lord says, "In order to make clear the ritual unity of the Eucharistic Prayer, it is recommended that there be a stylistic unity to the musical elements of the prayer, especially the Holy, Holy, the Memorial Acclamation, and the Great Amen. As much as possible, elements such as the preface dialogue and preface should be chanted at a pitch that best relates them to the key and modality of the other sung elements of the Eucharistic Prayer. It is likewise appropriate for priests to sing the entire Eucharistic Prayer, especially on solemn occasions."

That last sentence is a bit incongruous since the documents already determine that the faithful have a significant part to play in the praying of the Eucharistic Prayer. Perhaps that last line should read, "It is appropriate for the presider, together with the assembly, to sing the entire Eucharistic Prayer." It is indeed a prayer of the priest and the people.

What does this have to do with cake baking? Well, just as you don't have a cake until you take it out of the oven, is it fair to say that Christ doesn't become present in the bread and wine until the Eucharistic Prayer is finished and the great Amen is sung? Is this why the church no longer speaks of the words of consecration but speak instead speaks of the words of institution. According to the documents the entire Eucharistic Prayer is what consecrates the bread and wine.

These liturgical principles have practical consequences for how we worship. For example, since the Eucharistic Prayer concludes with the intercessions just before the doxology and great Amen, the musical setting for those intercessions should be the same as the one used for the general intercessions, also known as the universal prayers. And since we always pray for the pope during the Eucharistic prayer, it is not necessary to pray for him twice, once during the universal prayer and again during the Eucharistic Prayer. God hears us the fist time. We use the format for Masses with children to help the children keep their attention throughout the Eucharistic Prayer. It turns out that format works for adults too.

For those who are interested in the question "At what moment does Christ become present in the Eucharist" (i.e., when is it a cake?) what are we to make of the action that the priest holds up the bread and chalice after the words of institution? Is the Christ really present there yet, and if not, what is that action all about? And why are some kneeling in adoration if there is no God to adore yet?

The liturgical renewal of Vatican II needs an updating. Few explore the liturgical changes or their implications. Many approach the new order of worship in the same minimalistic way they approached the old. Rather than focus on the Eucharistic presence, the powers that be could better spend their time speaking about the purpose of our Sunday worship, full active participation, why we sing, the role of the assembly in worship, and a lot more. This simple paragraph from the document Sing to the Lord, sums it up nicely. "Charity, justice, and evangelization are thus the normal consequences of liturgical celebration. Particularly inspired by sung participation, the body of the Word Incarnate goes forth to spread the Gospel with full force and compassion. In this way, the Church leads men and women to the faith, freedom and peace of Christ by the example of its life and teaching". That's what I/we are trying to do here each Sunday.
