What is our Haiti Mission

On Oct 21 we will be having our Haiti fundraiser. We have not had one for three years because of Covid. Those of you who have joined the parish during that time may not know the history behind this effort.

When our three parishes merged into one in 2010, we tried to keep some things that would help this merge bring some level of comfort and familiarity to all those who ended up here. From St. Patrick we got the Blessed Trinity artwork that is on the wall behind the baptismal font. (When St. Patrick reopened, the pastor said we should keep it.) From Annunciation we received the memorial of Cleveland martyrs; Ralph Delaney, Sr. Dorothy Kazel and Jean Donovan. Annunciation also had a mission endeavor in Haiti

I have always believed that, just as Jimmy Menkhaus talked about on Tuesday, that each person must have a missionary spirit, a parish also must be missionary, must go outside of itself as part of its broader mission. And so our new parish took on a mission in Haiti in a new place called Baraderes.

Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. Baraderes is one of the poorest rural communities in Haiti. It takes eight hours to get there by car, and that's when the roads are passable and the gangs are not kidnapping people.

Since 2010, about 20 people from the parish have visited our sister parish in Baraderes. When things calm down there, we hope to resume our visits. Here are some of the things we have been able to do there.

The Fraternity of the Little Sisters has been working there for many years. When we connected with them, we helped them build a school for women to learn how to work in a restaurant. We bought sewing machines so that they could learn haberdashery and get a job as a seamstress.

Some parishioners brought their expertise in gardening and helped them plant new varieties of vegetables and flowers. Others just brought their muscles and chipped in wherever help was needed.

One year our financial contribution enabled them to dig a new well for water. On another occasion we had a medical mission where we took down eyeglasses, medicines and toiletries.

We also collaborate with Uplift Haiti which works in the surrounding villages. Uplift Haiti taught the Haitian people how to plant and harvest coffee beans, create their own cooperative and learn how to market it internationally. The Haitian coffee that we sell each second Sunday of the month is from this coffee cooperative.

The money that we have raised from past fundraisers has also gone toward the purchase of a new used truck. The old one died.

Since 2010, Haiti has suffered from a devastating earthquake, record setting hurricanes and an overthrow of the government. This poor country can't seem to find a break. Compared to Haiti we, as individuals and as a country, are wealthy beyond belief.

So, plan to attend our fundraiser for Haiti on October 21. It will be held at the St. Mel Party Center on Triskett Ave. A better cause you could not find.
