OUR MISSION STATEMENT





FROM FR. DOUG'S DESK



From the Desk of Fr. Doug.... Acts 9:6

The other day I was thinking about what I did when I was first ordained. At my first assignment, the pastor and principal pretty much told me what they wanted me to do. I was teaching several different religion classes in the school once a week. I would train lectors and servers. I would help plan the liturgies. I did inquiry classes, later called RCIA, I visited the hospital every Tuesday to see parishioners. (In those days people entered the hospital on Monday and were there for several days). I led bible studies. I'd take communion to the homebound on the first Friday of the month. The associate pastors would get together the first Friday of the month to socialize. There were about ten of us in the area. I did marriage preparation and annulments. People would come for counseling, help with decision making or spiritual advice. I ran the baptism classes. I helped the eighth graders put on a production of Godspell. I'm sure there was more but that was 44 years ago. Don't remember it all.

Fast forward 44 years. Things have changed. We don't have a school. Steve and Ann Suding train the servers. Jane Soposky and others direct RCIA. Carla Fritch leads bible study. Eric Russell coordinates the Bountiful Basement. There are no associate pastors nearby and two pastors in the West Park area have two parishes. We average one wedding a year. No one has asked for an annulment and now only designated priests can do them. People are in and out of the hospital before I can get there. Lay people take communion to the homebound. Stephen Ministry prays with and guides their care receivers.

What am I supposed to do?

After St. Paul has his conversion experience, he is told in Acts 9:6, "Arise, enter the

city, and you will be told what you are to do." That passage from Scripture is what is guiding my ministry these days. And that is why we have "What's on Your Mind?" gatherings from time to time.

"What's on Your Mind" gatherings take the place of our parish council. We have them because no one wanted to be on parish council but we still need to listen to each other. They are opportunities for you to tell me what I am to do. Of course, that's a little bit clerical, too. They are opportunities to talk about where and how we want to move forward as a parish. They are also opportunities to evaluate where we are as a parish. A while back we were a part of the ISPD, Institute for School and Parish Development. From that program we developed our AWE program, "Affirming, Welcoming and Engaging". As part of that program, each year we would do a survey of the parish. Perhaps it is time to do one of those again. What questions would you like to see on it? What would you like to tell me to do? What would you like to say to the parish staff? We must be proactive about this. There is a tendency to think that we are an active parish but we have to define that "we". 80% of the parish does not participate in anything outside of Mass. Out of 850 parishioners, about fifteen participate in bible study, 20 show up for men's ministry, forty five at the Don Cozzens lecture series, 11 for witness in solidarity with Ukraine and, as we heard today, only 39 families participating in the gift card program.

There is work to be done to get more involvement from people who just come to Mass. Our next "What's On Your Mind" gathering will be on Saturday, Oct 29 at 10:00am in the Joseph Center. Plan to attend. The life of our parish depends on it.
