

FROM FR. DOUG'S DESK



From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Of This and That

Many thanks to the members of the Finance Council who delivered the annual financial report to the diocese. I did want to clarify something that I wrote that may have been unclear. There were two large sources of income last year. One was the sale of the Ascension Village property. Before the sale, we were getting \$1600 a month in rent. That contract was good through the year 2035. With the sale of the property, the parish netted \$200,000. If that money is invested and earns only 1% interest, we make \$2000 a month AND we will have the \$200,000 after the year 2035.

The other source of income was the sale of the property that we owned at 14200 Puritas Ave. Since we received this property as a gift from the city for \$45, it seemed morally right that we sell it for that same amount. But canon law (church law) forbids the sale of property below its actual value. The value of that property was appraised at \$130,000, roughly the same amount that we owed the diocese, a debt that we inherited from Ascension Parish's past assessments. We sold the property for \$50. But the value of the property was \$130,000. Since there was no money involved but only value, the diocese subtracted the appraised value of the property to cancel our debt to the diocese. Actually, this was my suggestion to the diocesan finance office and they thought it was a good idea. That way we could be fair to the buyer and also fulfill the requirements of canon law.

Now we are debt free. The other \$200,000 is invested and we have more income from interest and dividends from that. In the financial talk we said that the diocese "cancelled

the debt". That sounded like they just wrote it off. They didn't. We paid our debt through the sale of that property.

The fall season is upon us and leaves are falling. If you'd like, you can bring your bagged leaves and grass clippings to the church and drop the bag off by the electric gate near edible forest two. Those leaves will be tilled into the clay soil to compost for better growing.

On Saturday, October 29 at 10:00am in the Joseph Center, we will be having another "What's On Your Mind" session. As I wrote last week, this is an opportunity for you to come and share your ideas or comments for the parish. Or just come and listen to what others are saying. This gathering is also a result of our AWE experience: affirming, welcoming and engaging the people of the parish.

There will be no vigil Mass for All Saints because many people like to stay home and distribute candy to children. Masses on All Saints Day (Tuesday, Nov. 1) will be at 8:30am and 12:05pm.

Planning ahead, on Wednesday evening at 7:00pm, Nov 2, All Souls Day, we will once again have a special memorial Mass for all those who died this past year. Everyone in the parish is encouraged to attend this special liturgy to support those who are grieving and to remember those who have died.

We are in need of ushers at each Mass, particularly to help take up the collection. If you are willing and able, please let me know. Also the microloan team and the Finance Council are seeking new members. If you'd like to help, please let me know.

Finally we are awaiting word from the diocese so that we can resume communion under the form of bread and wine. No word yet.
