

James 5:7

"See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains". I'm not sure if James had this in mind but I tallied the amount of produce we grew this year for my annual report to OSU Extension. It was not a great year for apples and pears, only 104 lbs. Here are the totals for other vegetables:

We produced a lot of fresh food for our clients at the bountiful basement. And I can't remember how many times I forgot to weigh what I picked that day, so the above numbers are a conservative amount. And that doesn't include the number of cherry tomatoes I popped into my mouth as I was harvesting tomatoes.

Special thanks to Katie. On many a morning we met at 5:00am to open the fire hydrant and water. Thanks also to Sr. Eilis McCulloh who also watered frequently.

This project could never happen without many hands. A number of organizations and confirmation groups came out and did some hours of community service. Many thanks to the many parishioners who helped prepare the beds in the spring, who weeded, who planted, who prayed over the plants or sang to them, who picked the harvest, who turned the compost piles and more. I have to say a special "thank you" to Diane Kortan who professed "I actually enjoy weeding!" Diane would go out to the edible forests and just weed like there was no tomorrow. A big thanks to Pat Soposky who maintains our electric fence and to all those who brought leaves and grass clippings to enrich the soil.

The agriculture development is a good use of our land. It puts Pope Francis' apostolic letter, Laudato Si, about the care of our planet into practice. At the same time it benefits the people in the neighborhood.

Part of these projects is also the making of mulberry jam, the harvesting of honey from the beehives, and making lotion and lip balm from the beeswax. Soon we will be making our dark chocolate raspberry jam.

Next year the fruit trees in Edible Forest II will be four years old. That means most of them will be producing fruit. Even the five new fig trees I planted this year will have figs. There will be two mature quince trees arriving in March that will bear fruit the same year. The only tree we have to wait for is the paw paw tree. It will be six more years before it bears fruit, but you will only be able to get them here.
