

Who Counts in a Parish?

Ten years ago about 12 parishioners and I attended a five week workshop from the Institute for School and Parish Development. We still use many of the techniques and idea that we learned in those sessions.

I pulled out my notes from those meetings just to review some of those ideas. The first was to look a typical Catholic parish, USA. In any given parish, 30% of those registered will be actively engaged, 30% will be uninvolved and 40% will be actively disengaged.

Actively engaged parishioners attend Mass regularly, support the parish financially, are involved in one or more parish ministries, see the parish as a basic part of the lives and have a basic understanding of stewardship/ ownership for the parish.

Uninvolved parishioners are those who attend Mass once in a while, are not involved in any parish ministries, give little to the parish with no pattern of giving, do not see the parish as an integral part of their lives and feel little or no sense of belonging to the parish.

Actively disengaged Catholics attend Mass maybe at Christmas and Easter (Chreasters), give nothing to the parish financially, and are not involved in any way.

The goal of the whole process is to increase the percentage of people in the parish who become actively engaged. This is done through a cyclical seven step process.

Identify the mission of our parish and our mission for the future. Do as "SWOT" analysis, i.e., what are the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats to our parish

Keep the parish informed via, bulletins,

flock notes, newspapers, fliers, emails and websites.

- Invite people personally. Make sure what you are inviting them to in meaningful to their lives.
- Involves as many people as possible into parish life. This gives people a sense of ownership and belonging. Belonging leas to believing and active engagement in parish life. Assess the gifts of each parishioner.
- Implement a plan of action. Many parishes have good ideas that never get farther than a committee meeting. What are the strategies to make sure someone is responsible to make sure things get done. Is the plan strategic? Measureable? Achievable? Realistic? What's the timetable for making that happen?
- Invest in the parishioners' time, talent, wisdom, expertise, and resources.
- Continue quality improvement. Evaluate efforts. Affirm what is good. Promote a culture of creativity and success. Advance the parish mission and ministries when necessary.

I took a quick tally of our parish. Out of 508 families, we have 135 actively engaged households. I created my own category, people who worship every week and support the parish financially but are not otherwise actively involved. That group totaled another 72 households. So 207 household in our parish actively worship on Saturday/Sunday. That's over 40% well above the national average. That doesn't count the 22 people who used to come regularly but are now in nursing homes or assisted living. So we can be glad about that >40% but dedicate more effort to the 60%.
