

FROM FR. DOUG'S DESK



From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Ever changing, Ever the same.

Last week I reminisced about the institute for School and Parish Development. At our parish synod (yes, we had a synod ten years ago before synods were fashionable!) the following challenges and solutions were discussed.

Challenge #1) How to improve communications in our parish? Use more technology. Facebook, Twitter, technology, constant emails, use local secular publications, phone calls, market our brand.

Challenge #2) How to get more people involved? Personal invitation, limit people's time to serve, educate the people about what 'welcoming' means, interview new parishioners, find out what attracted them, what are the parishioners' gifts,

Challenge #3) How to improve our greeter ministry? Make sure there are greeters at all doors of the church for each Mass. Provide training, this is not the same ministry as being an usher, learn people's names, acknowledge unfamiliar faces and ask what brought them here today.

Challenge #4) How to attract young families with small children? Ask young parents what they need, advertise our wonderful Atrium, is babysitting needed, have families bring up the gifts, have children be greeters, have cloth books for kids to use during Mass to occupy them,

Challenge #5) How to attract people ages 18-35? Have a sports night, have a movie night, what are the youth of today interested in? Have special outreach meetings for this age group? Why be a disciple in today's day and age.

Challenge #6) How to improve out hospi-

tality? Bless first timers in the assembly, make sure each person welcomes a new face if sitting beside them, leave pew for the sign of peace.

Challenge #7) How to attract non church-going Catholics? Have a ministry fair, blood screening, little seminars about Vatican II, how to get an annulment, talk about how religion is relevant to daily lives — or is it, use our new electronic sign to invite, who's hurt and can we help.

As you can see, our efforts over the past ten years have yielded some terrific results. At the same time, we can see that the challenges of ten years ago are the same challenges of today.

One thing we learned was that our approach to young people did not include young people! We didn't ask them if they wanted a sports night or a movie night. The institutional church has lost credibility with many people, but most notably younger people. The only way to build that trust again is for our parish to be faithful to what Jesus said and did so that young people can put their trust in us on the local level.

On another note, we will be decorating the church on December 23 after the 9:00am Mass. Help is needed to set up the manger scene, put up Christmas trees, arrange poinsettias, etc. This could be a fun family affair since the kids are on vacation. It gives children a sense of belonging to the parish when they are a part of something tangible. Belonging leads to believing. Coffee and donuts and orange juice will be provided.
