






From the Desk of Fr. Doug

The Radically Inclusive Love of Jesus

How big is God's love? Scientists tell us that so far, there are at least one hundred billion galaxies in the universe and that each galaxy has over one hundred billion stars. God's love is bigger than that.

The One who has many names, who created this universe, whom we believe became flesh in this humble, poor, immigrant baby, is much bigger than a lot of the repetitive dead language that institutional religion has used up until now. What we need in the world are communities of faith that care more about being a movement of justice and inclusion than being an institution; that choose inspiration over institution; that choose compassion and forgiveness and justice and peace over the status quo. And if we don't do that, we will be reduced to bad religion, tight restrictive narrow religion and theology. And that kind of religion really *does* kill.

Everyone who is hurting tonight, and everyone who is hurting others tonight, is living under an abusive and suffocating theology or philosophy that bears no resemblance to Christmas' love.

The heart of Christianity and Christmas is this: wherever there is exclusion or despair or oppression or bigotry or injustice or violence tonight, whether expressed externally toward others or internally toward ourselves, Christmas says, in the voice of the angels, "Do not be afraid; I bring you tidings of great joy for all people".

You can have the dark night of the soul where everything is as bleak as a Palestinian hillside; you can be the victim of an oppressive occupation where there is little hope in the Middle East, the same Middle East where Mary and Joseph experienced hardship as they had to travel a long distance to register for an economically unjust taxation of the

poor; you can experience that there is no room in life either for you, for who you really are, or for you to take care of your own health needs as a woman as Mary experienced when the innkeeper when he told her there was no room in the inn for her to have her baby; you can be as poor as the shepherds were that night, the poorest of the poor. Since they were too poor to pay the temple tax or to buy an animal to sacrifice, they were known as the lowest of sinners; you can be someone who cares little about religion or who places your hopes in science as did the three wise persons, the Magi, from the East. Whoever you are, wherever you find yourself on the journey of life, God's love is there for you.

The light of the star and the song of the angels sing for you tonight. But if your religious beliefs do not lead you to a radically inclusive love of all of God's people, then you misunderstand what this day is about.

Michelangelo, the great sculpture, architect, painter when he was 87 years old said, "I still have more learning to do." So come back next year and see how we're still learning, still redoing this Christmas thing, until we have global peace, global justice, global inclusion and the presence of the radically inclusive unconditional love of Jesus.

A mature God creates mature people; a big God creates big people; a constricting God creates constricting people; an angry God creates angry people; a vindictive God creates vindictive people; those with a fearful world view carry within them a fear-oriented God. Make sure that you don't adopt a religion that says, "just love those who love us," but rather participate in a larger love, a divine love. Participate in something larger than yourself.

"If you want to honor Jesus today, love someone who is hard for you to love". MLK
