OUR MISSION STATEMENT



FROM FR. DOUG'S DESK



Sacraments Today

One of the blessings of our parish is the celebration of baptism. When people enter the church and realize that we are going to have a baptism, the universal reaction is "Oh good, there's a baptism today. I love the way we celebrate this sacrament." All sacraments are meant to be celebrated within the context of the Sunday liturgy with the presence of the community.

Church law for the Rite of Baptism insists that, if possible, infant baptisms should take place during Sunday Mass with the parish community gathered around. With the increase of faith formation, liturgical catechesis and Scripture study encouraged by the Second Vatican Council, the understanding of sacramental theology has been more fully developed.

Referring to baptism celebrated on Sunday afternoon as a "private" baptism is contrary to the very nature of a sacrament. All sacraments are communal celebrations. They are celebrations of the Body of Christ with Christ our Head. The plural language, "we," "us," "our" used in the texts of each liturgy and the dialogical model of prayer confirms the communal nature of all the rites of the Church.

Sacraments affect not only the ones receiving the sacrament but also have a profound effect on the entire Body of Christ, the Church. With this understanding of the communal nature of the sacraments, the reason for celebrations within the Christian community becomes more apparent.

Celebrating a baptism within the Christian community is especially significant since it is the first of the initiation sacraments.

In addition to the welcome the community provides for these newest members and their families, our entire Christian community renews our own Baptismal promises and commitments and gives witness to our faith. This communal celebration reminds us of our responsibility to support and nurture the faith of one another.

As our young people prepare for receiving the Eucharist for the first time, they will learn that there is no such thing as "my" first communion just as there is no such thing as a private baptism. "My" and comm-"union" don't go together. It's an oxymoron. It is we who welcome those who come to the table for the first time.

Communal celebrations of the sacraments of reconciliation with general absolution are still allowed by Church law, but not permitted in the United States. This is unfortunate because so many found the communal celebration of the sacrament so meaningful, precisely because it was the action of the community.

Mass (Eucharist) is a communal celebration. Did you know that a priest is not allowed to celebrate Mass by himself except under special circumstances? That's because there is no community present.

Although a marriage can be performed outside of Mass, again the law states that it should be done in the context of Mass if at all possible. This is for the same reason. We, the community of faith, journey with the married couple and support them by our experience and faith.

The same is true for the sacrament of the sick. Since COVID, we have been celebrating that sacrament after Mass. Once again we will have a communal celebration of the anointing of the sick at all the weekend Masses on March 18/19, the fourth Sunday of Lent. The Gospel story or that Sunday is the healing of the man born blind.
