FROM FR. DOUG'S DESK



A Lenten Suggestion

This Wednesday the season of Lent begins. The Gospel for Ash Wednesday every year comes from the Good News as told to us by Matthew, chapter 6. In this passage Matthew reminds his readers of the three penitential practices available to us during the Lenten season. They are prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

If you are considering a cause for your almsgiving, may I suggest the Bountiful Basement?

The Bountiful Basement has been swamped with neighbors needing food. We have been blessed to have so many disciples working to make our hunger center run so smoothly. No one receives any money for the ministry that they perform.

We have people assembling bags, ordering the food online from the Food Bank, directing traffic, carrying bags up the stairs and more. Marilyn and Mike Dewees. Tony and Jeannette Weber, Mike McCann and Joyce Humel McCann and Lee and Jean Arquero all visit Giant Eagle and Longhorn Restaurant to get as much free food donated as those stores are able to part with.

The Hunger Network asked that we give out three days' worth of food. Then they changed it two five days' worth of food. Then they made it seven days' worth of food. That comes to at least ten bags per family.

At the same time, we were helping a significant number of people outside of our boundaries as well as emergency allocations to anyone who showed up.

Now the Bountiful Basement is operating at a deficit. We are over \$6000 in the red which was borrowed from the general fund of the parish but must be repaid. Eric Russell, Dick Beercheck, Katie and Linda and I met to brainstorm to see how we could cut costs. This is what we came up with.

All this month each client will receive a letter explaining our new food distribution policy and why we need to change it.

Previously families who lived out-

side of our boundaries were receiving the same ten day supply of food that those who lived within our boundaries get. From now on they will receive one or two emergency bags of food and be directed to the hunger center where they qualify.

Previously families who already received their one time monthly quota of food would come back and get an emergency supplement. We have cut down this supplement to one or two bags of food.

The Monday delivery of food from the Food Bank is \$360. If we rent our own U-Haul and pay a driver, it would cost us less than \$100. That's a \$260 saving a week. We just have to find enough drivers to take turns to drive.

In addition to food given out at the Bountiful Basement, there are at least five and maybe as many as seven opportunities for people to get free fresh vegetables and fruits at the mobile pantries in the West Park area. These pantries are once a month and have no residency restriction about who can receive food. You can go to each one every month.

The timing for this new policy could not be worse for the people. The county is cutting back on food stamps at the end of this month. The federal government has ceased its emergency food assistance fund because of COVID. Prices of almost everything are up and if they are the same, the amount of food inside is often less.

And yet, we cannot continue to operate as before. And we must also make up the deficit. So this Lent, if you are so disposed, I invite you to let the Bountiful Basement be the Lenten recipient of your Lenten almsgiving. On the first Sunday of Lent, that is a week from today, there will be an envelope in the pew for this. Place your check or cash in the envelope and place it in the collection basket.

Thank you in advance for your generosity. Happy Lent.
