FROM FR. DOUG'S DESK



Volunteers vs. Disciples

Part of my ordination rite included an explanation by Bishop Murphy that we deacons had been preparing for ministry in the diocese of Cleveland. The seminary faculty said that, to the best of their knowledge, we were prepared. Then the bishop asked the assembly to affirm that we had been called by the community. The community gave their assent by applause. There were 13 of us being ordained so the cathedral was packed with family and friends. The congregation affirmed our call with a thunderous and sustained applause that was quite moving and powerful for us.

When Bishop Lennon came, he changed that response of the congregation. Instead of applause, he had the congregation chant "Thanks be to God." It was like popping the air out of a balloon. That response did not have the same effect. But what Bishop Lennon was trying to do was to distinguish between the meaning of applause (congrats for a job or performance well done) and a ritual response (to acclaim what the grace of God has done).

This is an important distinction. There are many occasions when we applaud in church. We applaud our promise of support for those in the Children of Light process. We are not congratulating the kids. When we celebrate a baptism, we sing Alleluia as I lift the baby from out of the font instead of applauding. We are celebrating God's work among us. We aren't congratulating the parents and godparents.

You often see me making a request for, or thanking "disciples". For example in the Bountiful Basement we have disciples filling orders and loading cars. But we also have volunteers do the same thing. And we also have people doing community service doing the same thing. It may look like the same thing but it's not. What's the difference? It's the motivation.

A volunteer sees a need and wants to help out.

A person doing community service, mandated or otherwise, is working to receive personal benefit.

A disciple is a student of Jesus Christ, putting the Gospel mandate into practice, feeding the hungry.

A volunteer is someone who freely gives his or her time and energy to a task, usually for some altruistic purpose. This is a good thing, even necessary. However, a disciple is a devoted follower, an apprentice. A disciple of Jesus is someone wholeheartedly devoted to the person, teaching and mission of Christ. While volunteerism can find a place within discipleship, it represents a tiny aspect of a far more demanding vocation.

Volunteers can do great things to love and care for others. However, they can also opt out when it is no longer convenient, when their volunteerism is seen as an exceptional act of service above the status quo. On the other hand, the disciple relates to the sons and daughters of God through the eyes of Christ—seeking to both see Jesus in them and be Jesus to them. They recognize that, like the incarnation, when we enter into the lives of others, we cannot simply opt out.

While volunteerism is and will remain an important way in which Christians can live out aspects of being disciples of Jesus, we must first cast off the assumptions of our consumerist culture that deceives us into believing that faithful obedience to God is yet another market option we can chose on a whim. What we need to see is those willing to embrace the vocation of genuine discipleship and to live lives of sacrificial service to God and others.
