#### **OUR MISSION STATEMENT**





## From the Desk of Fr. Doug

This weekend we celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick at all the Masses.

The Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament that is frequently misunderstood. When I receive hospice calls asking me to come to a home or hospital to minister to a dying patient, the requests are usually for "last rites." When, during more routine visits, I offer to administer the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, people often react as though I had suggested the patient were dying. The use of the term "last rites" and the association of Anointing of this Sick with impending death are based on a misunderstanding of the nature of this sacrament and its administration in the contemporary Church.

Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy more than fifty years ago from the Second Vatican Council states (SSC 73):

Anointing of the Sick is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as any one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or "old age", the fitting time for him/her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. The Vatican has suggested age 65 or older as an appropriate age to receive the sacrament of the sick. Those who are 65 or older are statistically "more in danger of death", than those who are 35.

This teaching was put into practice through the 1972 instruction of Pope Pius VI, who declared, "The sacrament of the anointing of the sick is administered to those who are dangerously ill" (Sacram Unctione Infirmorum). So, for many decades now, the teaching of the Church has been clear: Anointing of the Sick is for the seriously sick and not just for the imminently dying.

This renewed understanding of the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, while correcting one misunderstanding – that it only for the dying –

has given rise to another – that is not for the dying at all, but for anyone who is sick. This misunderstanding is reflected in some celebrations of Anointing within Mass at which Anointing of the Sick is administered to everyone indiscriminately. It should not be. This sacrament is for those who suffer from a chronic illness such as diabetes, not a cold or broken bone.

The Catechism enumerates four effects of the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. The first effect listed in the Catechism is "a particular gift of the Holy Spirit" by which the sick person receives "strengthening, peace and courage to overcome the difficulties that go with the condition of serious illness or the frailty of old age". This gift of the Spirt intends a two-fold healing: "to lead the sick person to healing of the soul, but also of the body if such is God's will." The second and third effects have to do with the sick person's union with the suffering Christ as a member of his body the Church. The sick person "is consecrated to bear grace by configuration to the Savior's redemptive Passion" and thereby "contributes to the sanctification of the Church and to the good of all."

The fourth effect of the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick concerns a sick person's "preparation for the final journey" (CCC 1523). The Catechism teaches, "The Anointing of the Sick completes our conformity to Christ, just as Baptism began it."

When you receive this sacrament, the priest anoints your forehead and the palms of your hands, so as you come forward, extend your arms forward, palms up.

"Last Rites" is actually something different from anointing of the sick. Those rites, plural) include confession, reception of communion called Viaticum, Latin for "goes with you on your way" and anointing. Those three rites constitute the Last Rites. It's an important distinction.
