

From the Desk of Fr. Doug

The Eucharistic Revival (part one)

Perhaps you have seen the billboards or heard elsewhere about the Eucharistic Revival.

The website for the revival says this. "Our world is hurting. We all need healing, yet many of us are separated from the very source of our strength. Jesus Christ invites us to return to the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Eucharist"

. The National Eucharistic Revival is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery here in the United States by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. So I thought it would be good to spend some time writing about the Eucharist over the next few weeks.

The Second Vatican Council did much more than change the Mass from Latin to English. That would be a rather perfunctory description of what the constitution on the liturgy actually did. For those too young to know of those days or too old to remember them, let me refresh your memory.

Before the Second Vatican Council there was no vigil Mass. People were not encouraged to arrive for the beginning of Mass but were informed that they had "made it to Mass" if they arrived before the Gospel. Otherwise they missed Mass and committed a mortal sin.

Receiving the Eucharist at Mass was not encouraged. In addition, the rules about going to communion made it difficult. A person could not eat anything from midnight on if they wanted to receive communion. Earlier Masses were more common and more crowded for this reason. Even then, only a few went to communion. By the time the noon Mass rolled around, very few people received communion.

What did people do at Mass? Some tried to follow along with liturgical aids that had Latin on one side and English on the other. But many people prayed the rosary during Mass.

There were no roles for lay people before the Second Vatican Council except altar server. Those servers had to be males, usually Catholic school students. In many places boys who attended public school could not be altar servers. There were no lay lectors. There were no lay Eucharistic ministers. There were only two readings and the priest read them both.

There was no three year cycle of readings. Each Mass concluded with the Gospel reading according to St. John 1:1-18.

The priest gave a sermon, not a homily. The sermon was about a topic of his choice. If the sermon had anything to do with the readings it was merely coincidental. Our pastor, Leo Schumacher, talked about abortion, birth control and communism at every Mass. Apparently he thought no one was listening so he kept repeating himself. But I digress.

We were supposed to be quiet in church. "People are praying" and God does not like talking.

Since most people didn't receive communion, there was no point in staying past that. People left after the priest received the host. And why not?

The main message, expressed both subtly and non-verbally, was "you are not good enough, worthy enough, or holy enough to receive communion." No matter your age, you are a sinner. And the Eucharist was for saints, not sinners. Every seven year old made their first confession the day before their first communion to be in the state of grace. Little boys and little girls wore white on their first communion day as did brides, and all for the same reason, to show they were pure enough and not too defiled to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

Though never stated outright, people thought they had to go to confession each time before they received communion. And if you were a Catholic marrying a non-Catholic, you couldn't have a Mass. You got married in the rectory. It was a demeaning, humiliating experience for those who chose to do so.

There was no universal prayer, commonly referred to as the petitions or prayers of the faithful. There was no sign of peace. There were no permanent deacons. There were no greeters because there was no talking. Father did everything.

I could probably think of some other things but you get the point. There was much more that happened at Vatican II besides changing the Mass from Latin to the vernacular, which for us is English. Stay tuned for more.
