

FROM FR. DOUG'S DESK



From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Eucharistic Revival (part three)

Looking back it's hard to imagine that we seniors grew up learning that the Mass had three parts: Offertory, Consecration and Communion. The only hint that we had that the word of God was important was that if you didn't get there before the Gospel, then you hadn't "gotten to" Mass. This omission was accompanied by the requisite mortal sin.

Today we speak of the need for the assembly to have "full, active, and conscious participation." The Mass is our communal prayer. We are not individuals who happen to be in the same room. We are a community gathered praying as one. There are a few consequences to this. The first is to understand ritual prayer. The second is "do what we, the community" are doing.

Our worship is filled with symbols, signs and actions that connect us with the divine. We carry the Gospel book in procession, but we don't carry it out. Why? Because it is supposed to be in our hearts now that we have heard it. Lectors and Eucharistic ministers sit within the assembly. We use bread and wine, symbols of many grains and grapes becoming one. We break the bread and share the cup, a sign that we are called to care for one another so that no one goes hungry. We exchange a sign of peace, Shalom, Namaste, to honor the God within each. We raise our hands in prayer at the Our Father. We extend our hands in blessing as we invoke to power of the Holy Spirit. Some couples, families, or congregations join hands during the Our Father, a sign of the unity of the disciples at prayers. Ritual prayer draws an emotional response from us. We end up leaving Mass saying, "Wasn't that beautiful?" instead of saying, "Wasn't that informative?".

Sometimes ritual prayer and action is meaningless or inappropriate. For example, on occasion someone will make the sign of the cross before receiving communion. Why would someone do that? It makes no sense. Or in some parishes

young parents bring their baby to be baptized already clothed in a white garment. This renders the part of the baptismal rite where the child is clothed in white as a sign of just having put on Christ, meaningless.

In addition to full, active and conscious participation, a simple liturgical but important principle is, "Do what you are doing". This is where many assemblies fall short. If the congregation is singing a hymn, then every parishioner should be singing. Every person should have a hymnal in their hands, praying the words.

If you're an usher, don't get up during the petitions. Pray the petitions with the congregation. When the universal prayer is over, then go get the collection baskets.

If the congregation is singing the gathering hymn, you should not be parking your car. You should already be in your pew. And if you arrive last second, you've missed music practice, announcements, reminders and the important moment when we gather our thoughts in silence and center ourselves.

A similar thing can be said at the end of Mass. If the assembly is singing the sending forth hymn, you should be singing it too, not leaving the church.

Last month, the winds were so strong that the interior doors of the church were banging. Every time they did, many people, myself included, kept looking over to see what was making all the noise. Late arrivals, early departures and unnecessary movement are the same kind of distraction. For example, I have asked funeral directors not to come up the aisles while I am saying the final commendation. If they do, heads turn in the direction of their movement and the people do not hear the words being said. Like the rest of us, they should do what we are doing.

It's easy to spot visitors to our church. Most often they don't sing, don't gesture, come late, leave before Mass is over. It makes one wonder what is happening in other parishes.
