

The Catholic Worker in Cleveland

The Catholic Worker Movement is a collection of autonomous communities of Catholics and their associates founded by Dorothy Day and Peter Maurin in the United States in 1933. Its aim is to "live in accordance with the justice and charity of Jesus Christ". One of its guiding principles is hospitality towards those on the margin of society, based on the principles of communitarianism and personalism. To this end, the movement claims over 240 local Catholic Worker communities providing social services. Each house has a different mission, going about the work of social justice in its own way, suited to its local region. But above all, every house seeks to build relationships with those who visit.

Catholic Worker houses are not official organs of the Catholic Church, and their activities, inspired by Day's example, may be more or less overtly religious in tone and inspiration depending on the particular institution. The movement campaigns for nonviolence and is active in opposing both war and the unequal global distribution of wealth. Day also founded the Catholic Worker newspaper, still published by the two Catholic Worker houses in New York City, and sold for a penny a copy.

In Cleveland, the Cleveland Catholic Worker is an intentional community that provides hospitality to the most vulnerable in our community (homeless, immigrants, unemployed). They seek to live simply in a communal setting and participate in political and faith—based resistance work. They offer many free services in their house and community center. The hospitality house is:

The Drop In center is located at 4241 Lorain Ave. Among the services they provide are: meals, showers, day labor support program, English classes, alternative health clinic, a prisoner support program and most importantly companionship.

Here is a quote from Dorothy Day's *The Long Loneliness*.

"Love is a commandment", Father Hugo said. It is a choice, a preference. If we love God with our whole hearts, how much heart have we left? If we love with our whole mind and soul and strength, how much mind and soul and strength have we left? We must live this life now. Death changes nothing. If we do not learn to enjoy God now we never will. If we do not learn to praise Him and thank Him and rejoice in Him now, we never will."

Dorothy Day learned an important truth. Yes, people need the basic necessities of life: food, shelter, water, safety but there is just as much a need for companionship, building relationships and making friends. This is what she tried to provide in her first houses of hospitality. That's something that we can all afford to do.
