From the Desk of Fr. Doug

Good Stewardship

You may have noticed that two weeks ago, the profit from gift card sales was \$361. That's because Sean Mueller, one of our former parishioner's brother, bought gas cards for his cleaning business. He has many trucks and makes a point to stop by and get gas cards rather than just have the drivers take the trucks to the gas station. We are grateful to Sean and all those who take the time to purchase gift cards. Because we buy them in bulk, we get a discount. That way we can sell them to you at cost and make money for our parish. It is a great way to support the parish financially without costing you anything.

The gift card program is part of a larger financial plan for our parish. The Finance Council and I are committed to never talking about money from the pulpit except for the annual financial report. Even that is more of a "thank you for your generosity" than anything else. Rather than ask for money, we believe that our parish is a "product" that is worth investing in. And if we make our parish attractive, people will buy into it, literally and figuratively.

As I look at where our parish will be five years from now, our goal is to make our parish totally self-sufficient. The Bountiful Basement does receive donations but it could operate without them if it had to. All the fruit and vegetables that we grow are given away at the present time, but they could be sold, or part of them could be sold, to make money. We give away thousands of dollars of food every year. There is also the sale of homemade mulberry jam, raspberry jam, loofas, cherries for pie and honey. This would enable the parish to function long after I am gone. Plus the parish won't have to pay my massive salary or Katie's meager one either.

We are blessed that people from across the diocese and the country look at our website and Facebook page and marvel at all the activities

that go on here. Not only do they marvel, they send checks! We are grateful for everyone's generosity, near and far.

On occasion some people have asked me what tithing is. In the bible, a tithe is an offering 10% of one's goods. In modern parlance, tithing is giving 5% of your net income to the church and another 5% to your favorite charities. This is strictly optional. We are more than aware of the woman in the bible praised by Jesus who gave her last two cents to the temple. Generosity is not defined by the amount given but by the desire to share. As Paul says in the letter to the Corinthians, "God loves a cheerful giver".

Blessed Trinity is a rock in our neighborhood. Along with Birchwood School, our presence keeps our neighborhood stable. I like to support other local businesses like Chuck's Auto, Café Everest, La Bendicion Pupuseria and Canary's. They also contribute to the stability of our neighborhood.
