

From the Desk of Fr. Doug

We Support Catholic Education

When Bishop Edward Malesic came to Cleveland, he became aware that Cleveland had one of the largest systems of Catholic schools in the United States. He also became aware of the challenges that schools face; rising costs of tuition, lack of Sunday worship among Catholic students and the need for diocesan support from all parishes, with or without being connected to a Catholic school.

Because Catholic schools cost a ton of money, there is a two tiered diocesan assessment package for parishes. Parishes that have a school pay an 11% assessment based on their annual Sunday contributions. Parishes without a school pay a 16.5% assessment. That is the first way that our parish supports Catholic Schools financially.

At our last Finance Council meeting we reviewed our current Catholic grade school financial aid policy. Since we have so many new young families with small children, I thought it would be good to review our current policy and see where we are going from here.

Our past policy was to grant each student in each family who was in a Catholic grade school up to \$1000 in school tuition assistance. Some students did not even need that much because the voucher or the Ed Choice grant paid most of the tuition.

There was no high school policy although, when asked, the parish granted the same \$1000 scholarship to each student, as needed.

The Finance Council has developed a new policy for grade school children. Henceforth, the parish will pay the difference between what the school charges for tuition and what the family owes. This is because some families with young children have made a deliberate choice to join our parish. Consequently they are lumped together by various titles, all meaning "non-parishioner" rate. We do not want them to be

punished for choosing our parish. That is why we have decided to be more generous. We also think it is more just. We have been giving \$1000 in tuition assistance since we were formed as a parish 13 years ago. Our scholarship aid has not kept up with costs and inflation.

Where is this tuition aid money coming from? We have an education endowment fund left over from Ascension days. The principal of \$98,000 cannot be touched but the interest can be spent on assistance. As best as we (i.e., Linda our finance manager) can tell, our interest totals about \$120,000 that we can spend on tuition grants. In addition there are monthly envelopes that designate donation toward Catholic Education.

What about the future? If you go to the "wrong" Mass, you may be asking yourself, where are the children? In reality, there are 66 children that belong to our parish under the age of 14. Of these 66, 45 are "active", namely they are in church and attend Mass almost every week.

The breakdown in age by birth year is as follows

And I know of at least one that is on the way for 2023. We do not know which, if any of these children will attend Catholic School but we will be ready to assist the parents in making Catholic education affordable.

At our next meeting, the Finance Council will discuss high school tuition aid. There are many more variables to consider when it comes to high school tuition.
