FROM FR. DOUG'S DESK



"I belong to the Church of Doug"

Have you even been flattered and saddened at the same time? I was when someone told me "I belong to the church of Doug". I knew what he meant. He liked my version of Catholicism and how Blessed Trinity's mission captures the message of Jesus Christ. In particular he liked our welcoming community, our inclusive mission, our interfaith activities, our vibrant and faith filled liturgies and our emphasis on social justice.

This man moved to the burbs for a while. He had been accepted and active in our parish. He had many friends here. As a black man in an interracial marriage the Catholic Church he found there was not welcoming. He told me that after Mass he would just stand there and no one, none of the white people, would talk to him. They weren't racist. They just weren't welcoming. Well, maybe there were some racists, too. Who knows?

He and his family moved back to Lakewood and rejoined our parish for a time. But he and his wife have four daughters. As he looked at the wider church, he saw that his daughters did not have a future in the Catholic church, especially if they felt a call to priesthood. Sure there were opportunities for women to be involved and to serve in the church, but not in many leadership positions and not in ways that celebrate their gifts. So they joined another Christian denomination where they are very active and where women have a voice. As a consequence, we lost a great family and I miss seeing my friend.

I share this story by way of introduction to join Blessed Trinity and our Catholic faith community. Our institutional Catholic church is not perfect. We know that. In fact it has many warts and pimples. So does Blessed Trinity. But here at BT we see a church in action, a church striving to be better, a church wishing to make a difference in the lives of its member and the people around us.

There are many non-Catholics who come

to Mass frequently, if not every Sunday with the rest of their families. We are so pleased that you join us for worship. And if you never become Catholic, that's okay too. But maybe you've never considered it. Maybe no one ever asked you.

I remember noticing that our flautist on Sunday, Janet Dubas, never went to communion. So one day I asked her. "Janet, why don't you go to communion." She said, "I'm not Catholic.' I said, "Well you're here every Sunday, would you like to become Catholic?" "No one ever invited me before," was the reply. Within a few weeks Janet was welcomed into our Catholic faith.

Being Catholic isn't so much accepting a set of beliefs as it is feeling that I belong. If you have four daughters, they might not have a future in the Catholic Church. But chances are, things will change soon because of the synod. Changes in the church usually come from within, not from without, or from the top.

Pope Francis has seen the need for change as well. He has appointed Archbishop Victor Manuel Fernandez, an enthusiastic supporter of his reformist program, to lead one of the most powerful curial offices the office of doctrine. Of greater significance is what the appointment says about the current moment in the Francis pontificate. Francis is almost 87 years old, and it is hard to imagine this tireless pope continuing at his current pace for too many more years. It increasingly appears as if the upcoming fall 2023 and 2024 assemblies of the synod on synodality in Rome will provide the denouement of this pontificate, the capstone of a papacy committed to bringing to fruition the still unrealized vision of the Second Vatican Council.

So if you or someone you know might be interested in joining our expression of Catholicism, please let me know. Classes will be starting up sometime in September.
