OUR MISSION STATEMENT





Eucharistic Revival (part 7)

When the church speaks of "the celebration of the Eucharist", we are talking about the Mass, God's people gathered together in prayer, praise and worship. This is what Jesus referred to when he said, "Do this in memory of me." We are not talking about Eucharistic adoration. One would think that, with this common understanding that we are a Eucharistic people, and that the celebration of the Eucharist is central to the practice of our faith, church leadership would do anything and everything imaginable to make the Mass easily available to as many disciples as possible. Alas, that has not happened. But what is happening in the meantime?

I was taken aback three weeks ago when Kathy Raffay related her experience of Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. It was an 8:00am Mass. There were some tourists but mostly parishioners in attendance. There was no musical accompaniment, no singing. People did not even speak their responses in an audible tone. Like a McDonald's sandwich, this liturgy was quick, tasty and cheap. St. Patrick's is the mother church of the diocese. One would think that among the 8 million people who live in NYC, they could afford someone to be a music minister.

Kathy's experience is not unique. Many of you tell me that when you are out of town and attend Mass at another church, it's the same story: minimal participation and little singing. People arriving late and leaving before the sending forth hymn is over. Conversely, when people come here to worship, your participation inspires them. Last week, when Fr. Carson was here, there was a contingent of Canadians who came to Blessed Trinity. They loved your welcoming spirit and full, active and conscious participation. After Mass they asked Todd Riedel to take their picture in front of the church as a remembrance of such a beautiful worship experience.

A Eucharistic revival should begin by focusing on Jesus Christ. Who was Jesus? Why would God want to become human? Show Jesus' compassion as a model for Christian living. "Be compassionate as your heavenly Father is compassionate." State why Jesus would leave this sacred sign for us "to do in memory of him." Lead people to see that discipleship means sharing and that we model that at each Eucharist when we break the bread, that sign of sharing and compassion for all. Emphasize that this is

why full, active and conscious participation in community worship is vital to our lives. Love is communal. We journey together.

The celebration of the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The Catholic catechism says #1324 The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life". The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch."137

#1325 "The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit."138

#1326 Finally, by the Eucharistic celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all.139

#1327 In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: "Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking."140

Now that cremation is more popular, do you have other questions about funerals, wakes and burials. Join Fr. Doug after the 4pm Mass on Aug 26 or after the 11am Mas on Aug 27 to discuss a wide range of topics related to death, dying and Christian burial. Fr. Doug will give a short presentation and then there will time to answer questions. Topics include, why have a funeral at all? why cremation? Is there a difference between a funeral Mass and a memorial Mass? power of wills, wakes, words of remembrance attorney, (eulogies), how to plan a funeral Mass, green burials, what to look for in a funeral home, what to look for in a cemetery, costs, cost of obituary announcements in the newspaper, in lieu of flowers..., and more. No registration. Just show up. It will be held in church.
