

From the Desk of Fr Doug.....





Advent begins next Sunday

You've probably heard of an Advent calendar. It anticipates the celebration of the birth of Jesus by counting down the days before Christmas arrives. Often the "doors" of the calendar are distributed across the calendar in no particular order. The calendar doors open to reveal an image, a poem, a portion of a story (such as the story of the Nativity of Jesus), or a small gift, such as a toy or a chocolate item. Often, each door has a Bible verse and Christian prayer printed on it, which Christians incorporate as part of their daily Advent devotions.

This year, we'd like to provide an opportunity for you to make your own calendar by creating a "reverse Advent calendar." Instead of getting a gift each day, you can give a gift. This is how to do it.

Advent begins on December 3 Get a box and mark the days before Christmas by placing an item into the box each day during Advent. If you light an Advent wreath at home, you can combine lighting the wreath by adding your own ritual prayer. For example, you could say, "Today we add boxed potatoes. We thank God for those who planted them and those who harvested them" or "Today we add a bar of soap. We pray for the homeless or those in war torn countries who have no soap or no place to wash themselves." Be creative. (P.S. Little children might enjoy learning where soap comes from. Also big children.)

When you come to Mass on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day, bring your box. The box may be heavy, so disciples will be outside the church to carry the box from your car to the church if you need help. If you carry the box in yourself, place it in the sanctuary or near the big Christmas trees in front of the cry room. The contents will go to the Bountiful Basement. In addition to helping us celebrate

Advent, your donations will help the Bountiful Basement after Christmas when donations often go down.

Feel free to substitute any of the items on the list. The Bountiful Basement can always use cleaning supplies, bar soap, a bottle of aspirin, pasta, soups, a package of Band-Aids, shampoo, mayonnaise, pickles, salad dressing, hamburger helper, stuffing mix, etc.

Travel sizes are acceptable, especially for more expensive items like laundry detergent. May the upcoming season of Advent be for you and yours, a time a gratitude and generosity.


