
OUR MISSION STATEMENT


to All God's People.

Advent to Christmas through Ordinary Time

"Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." The magi interrupted their lives to follow the star, wholeheartedly journeying in faith, searching for Jesus. When they found the child, they were overjoyed and offered their gifts.

Our Advent season gives us an invitation to deliberately interrupt our lives, to wholeheartedly journey in faith, to find Jesus in daily life. Especially at this time of year, I consider my job such a privilege.

Each Advent I look forward to the call from St. Bernadette Parish. Would we like to participate in their Adopt-a-Family Christmas Program? They have partnered with Blessed Trinity for 14 years (and with Annunciation Church for I don't know how long before our merger). In our earliest connection, St. Bernadette parishioners shopped for the wish lists of our families with children, providing gifts and all the fixins for Christmas dinner. Over the years, the face of our parish has changed. It wasn't families with children who could use some Christmas joy, but many of our senior citizens. St. Bernadette adapted their program and would now provide gifts for our seniors' wish lists. Covid brought further changes, but still not an end to the program. Currently St. Bernadette parishioners purchase gift cards they give to us, which we distribute to those who can use some Christmas cheer.

The St. Bernadette parishioners never see the faces of those whose lives they touch and yet they continue to do what they do, this year gifting us with \$5,300 in gift cards. We were also blessed to receive generous donations of cash, gift cards, toys, games, Christmas cookies, children's winter coats, clothing, and an entire truckload of food for the Bountiful Basement from several parishioners and friends of Blessed Trinity.

These gifts, distributed by the parish and SVDP, brought Christmas joy to more than 50 households. Most of the givers never saw the impact of their selfless giving.

... and they offered their gifts. I see the smiles and the tears. I get the hugs and hear the stories of what this outreach means. I repeat, what a privilege this job of mine is! How else to describe a job where the "work" is to see the face of Christ!

Ordinary Time follows the Christmas Season. "Ordinary" comes from the Latin *ordinalis*, which means numbered. Each week in Ordinary Time is numbered, but not ordinary, as it is a time to deepen one's prayer life, spiritual reading, and practice to grow to be more like Jesus.

Ordinary Time 2024 has me thinking of years and numbers. The gift those 14 Advent and Christmas seasons on staff at Blessed Trinity have been to me; my 33 years of service in the Diocese; turning 70. That reflection has brought me to the decision that this will be the year of my retirement. The exact date I don't know yet. As we plan for it, some tasks I do others can learn and take over. For example, ordering for the Community Meal could be done even from home. More to come on that...




