

From Doug's desk...







Just got home from El Salvador after a wonderful trip. What a difference forty years makes. In 1980, Saint Oscar Romero had his funeral interrupted at the national plaza. People scattered in all directions as bullets flew by. They never finished the funeral mass. The team pushed Bishop Hickey back into the cathedral for protection. During those years, people lived in fear. Tourism was nonexistent. The beaches were filled with rocks and sewage. There were curfews. 80,000 people disappeared or were killed.

When I left in 1986, the civil war was raging. When the war ended, the gangs took over and terrorized the people. Those who had not fled during the war fled because of gang threats. The fear was worse than before. People were afraid to leave their homes for work. Gang members took a percentage of small business's profits and often they took a pretty girl for their pleasure.

Then came a new president in 2020. The beaches got cleaned up. Parks were built He invested in the small person. The national park where Romero's mass was interrupted is now a vehicle free zone. There is a beautiful park. There is a walking path, dancing fountains, and a new five story library. People walk around with pride in their country, free from fear of gang members.

In the city of La Libertad, where I used to live and work, there are now 150 restaurants along the coast. The beaches are filled with tourists. Surfers come from all over the world for international competitions. There are new hotels. You can catch an Uber or a taxi. All those restaurants mean jobs as chefs, waiters, dishwashers, janitors, and security that did not exist before. The govern-

ment built a kiddie park like Memphis Kiddie Park. It has 8 rides, a roller coaster, a Ferris wheel, and other rides I don't know how to describe. That means jobs as mechanics and quality control. There are ponies for little children. The park is closed on Mondays and Tuesdays. On Wednesdays it is open only for school field trips. All the rides are free. School children come from all over the country to enjoy this one of a kind place in El Salvador.

Cerro Verde, which means "the green mountain," has been completely renovated. There is a beautiful hotel and several restaurants that overlook the extinct volcano, Izalco. It is breathtaking. I was there years ago when everything sat in disarray and maybe there were three other cars. There were no less than 150 cars when we visited this time.

The capital, San Salvador, is no longer listed as one of the 50 most dangerous cities in the world. Last year, 200 people died by gunshot. There were no mass murders. That's in a country whose population is 8 million. In greater Cleveland, there were over 300 murders last year. Many Salvadorans are leaving the United States to return home. It is safer for them.

Forty years is a long time to wait for peace and prosperity. But there was a time when the paradise that El Salvador is now was but a pipe dream. Perhaps the same can happen in Gaza in 40 years.




