



## THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME













With Katie's birthday last November, everyone on the parish staff is in their 70's except for Krystal Rodriguez, our parish office manager. Shortly afterwards, Katie announced her upcoming retirement this year. This highlights the question of age.

Age has been a topic all year. Many cite Biden's age as too old to run again. Others say that Trump is only three years younger and equally too old. But Pope Francis is 87. Look what he has done in a few years. Francis presided over the first stage of his legacy-making meeting on the future of the Catholic Church. The first session ended with "urgent" calls to include women in decision-making roles in the church. The next phase is scheduled for October 2024.

"The effort to change the rigidly top-down nature of governance in Catholicism is the main reform project of the Francis papacy and its success or failure will likely be his chief legacy," said Fordham's Gibson. He said the jury was still out on whether it would succeed, since the transition period is "messy and absolutely exhausting."

Alongside the synod, Francis this year appointed an unusually progressive theologian as the Vatican's chief doctrine watchdog, and he has already begun setting a very new tone for the church's teachings that could have big effects on the church going forward.

Cardinal Victor Fernandez has issued decrees on everything from how to care for cremated ashes (in a defined and sacred place) to membership in Masonic lodges (forbidden) and whether transgender people can be godparents (they can). And priests can now bless couples who are in a union that is either between a divorced and remarried person or same sex couples. For a church that just apologized to Galileo after 500 years, that's breakneck speed. It's not just Pope Francis. It's the quality people he has surrounded himself with.

Francis exiled Archbishop Gaenswein to his native Germany after a series of infractions culminating with a tell-all memoir published in the days after Benedict's death that was highly critical of Francis. He forcibly removed the bishop of Tyler, Texas, Bishop Joseph Strickland, whose social media posts were highly critical of the pope. He cut off the former Vatican high court judge, Cardinal Raymond Burke, after he warned that Francis' reform-minded synod risked dividing the faithful.

John XXIII was 76 years old when elected pope. At 77, he called for an ecumenical council. He began the reform of the church by that Second Vatican Council.

It's not the age alone that is a factor. It's the people that the person in charge surrounds him/ herself with, whether pastor, president or pope. No one does it alone. Well no one in their right mind would say, "I alone can fix it." It takes a team of people who share the same vision, the same goals, the same theology, the same commitment. We have been blessed with such people in Katie, and Deacon Dick, and Ginger, and Carol Roberts, and Deacon Jack, and Linda Wilson. In addition we have been surrounded with wonderful disciples who do everything from lead bible study and RCIA and Breaking Open the Word to leading small faith groups in the parish. These spiritual gurus are as important to the parish leadership team as are the paid ones. Yes, the team is old. We ache sometimes. I know I have slowed down a lot this past year. But it's not just our age that matters. Our parish is alive and vibrant. We are blessed with good leadership and good disciples who respond to that call because they share the same vision.

Like Joe Biden and Pope Francis, our parish is blessed with people besides the guy at the top that make things happen. We are blessed.


