

Wild Imaginations

Fear of the unknown frequently causes our worst angels to surface. Think of all the movies about aliens from outer space either coming to Earth or us going to them. Other than E.T. the Extraterrestrial, was there ever an alien that didn't want to eat us up or invade our bodies or conquer the world?

How come we don't imagine Martians bringing us a cure for cancer or diabetes? Or show us how their world developed without the stain of Adam's sin. It's always fire and brimstone, death and destruction.

A similar response came from people regarding the solar eclipse. Some predicted the end of the world. It prompted a few Catholics to think of more ominous omens.

"When the sun loses its light ... that is the unraveling of the cosmic created order that God the Father placed upon the universe through God the Son," Taylor Marshall, the far -right Catholic podcaster, said in a ten-minute YouTube video titled, "Solar Eclipse? Black Sun in the Apocalypse?" Marshall later segued into a more apocalyptic telling of solar eclipses, linking them to Revelation's enigmatic descriptions of the end times. He also likened eclipses to foreshadowing's of the Earth's final chapter and the "three days of darkness" that some Christian mystics believe will envelop the dying planet.

Other Catholic fringe voices were not going to let an opportunity pass Monday (April 8) without commenting on social media about the "most important eclipse of all," that being the "Eclipse of the Catholic Church" which they believe began with the Second Vatican Council and now continues under anti-Pope Francis.

To "counter expected satanic activity," Bishop Joseph Strickland planned to celebrate Mass during the eclipse, which was to be livestreamed by LifeSiteNews, the far-right Catholic outlet.

Where were the voices of optimism asking, "Perhaps we will be able to see heaven during the eclipse." Perhaps with everyone's attention being on the eclipse, we'll notice that there was no crime going on. Everyone was in a good mood, and the event itself was beyond expectation.

We had a nice little party on the parish grounds for the eclipse. Participants brought chairs. Some brought extra chairs just in case. Everyone brought water but me. Some shared snacks.

My eclipse experience reminded me of my Grand Canyon experience. I had seen many pictures of the Grand Canyon, but seeing it up close and personal was breathtaking. The same thing happened to me with the solar eclipse. I had seen many pictures of an eclipse. But seeing one in real time was remarkable, almost a participation in the divine. We all just kept saying "Oh, wow!" and then we'd say "Oh wow" again because one time didn't seem to be sufficient. Also, when it got eerily dark, the horizon looked like a beautiful sunset in all directions.

After the totality of the eclipse ended, many headed home. But Luc Gauvin and I did a tour of edible forest II. Pear trees and apple trees and peach trees have started to bloom. The blossoms were beautiful to behold. Then Luc found the remains of what we think was a leaf. All of the leaf part of the leaf was eaten and all that remained were the veins. It looked like a skeleton. It, too, was a marvelous sight. Luc commented how beautiful God's creation is, big and small. It was a great day for an eclipse. It was almost a glimpse of heaven.
