

From the Desk of Fr. Doug Happy Mother's Day

We pray for all our mothers living and deceased today. There will be a special Mother's Day blessing at the end of Mass.

Pentecost is next Sunday. It is the first of many Pentecosts in the bible (Don't forget to wear red.) It is the birthday of the church. It is the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. But it is only one of many times the Spirit came upon the disciples.

In Acts 2:1-4 we read, "When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them".

We also hear about who was present. Acts 1:13-14: "Those present were Peter, John, James and Andrew; Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew; James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers". So, when you picture that first Pentecost, imagine something like the picture of it in our church.

Acts 4:31: After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly.

I've never participated in a Confirmation ceremony where this happened. I wonder, why?

Acts 10:44-48: While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit came on all who heard the message. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on Gentiles. For they heard them speaking in tongues and praising God.

Then Peter said, "Surely no one can stand in the way of their being baptized with water. They have received the Holy Spirit just as we have." So he ordered that they be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked Peter to stay with them for a few days.

There are any number of clergy who would indeed stand in the way of them being baptized after they were confirmed. God is not a prisoner of our liturgical celebrations.

Acts 19:6-7: When Paul placed his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied. There were about twelve men in all.

This is the only passage in Acts when the Holy Spirit only descends upon men.

The early church looked very different than our church today. There was much less structure. It was unclear who was in charge. At times, it is James, not Peter that seems to head up the church. The early followers considered themselves missionary disciples. Women were included in everything. Having discovered the futility of achieving sanctity through rule following (pharisaic law), the early church relied on the spirit to move her.

Sunday, May 26 is vegetable and flower planting. Come join in the fun after the 11:00am Mass.
