

OUR MISSION STATEMENT



We Are the Sign of Unity at Mass

One of the main themes of any Eucharistic liturgy is unity. So often in our prayers and in the readings we hear a call for unity, "that we may be one". We have heard that recently in the readings from the bread of life discourse.

One of the ways we show our unity is by praying "together". We do this almost naturally, without thinking about it, but it is there as plain as day. We do not sing hymns at our own pace. We sing together. We do not say the responses at the speed we wish to say them. We say them together. We pray the Our Father together. These simple examples express our unity.

We also express our unity with our body language. The Mass is neither a private prayer nor a personal devotion. It is the prayer of the church. It is the community who prays the Mass. The priest is a part of the community. We all stand when we should be standing. This shows the unity that we share. We all sit when we should be sitting. We make the sign of the cross together. We sign ourselves before we hear the Gospel together. We share the sign of peace together. These liturgical gestures reflect our unity. If not for the sake of good liturgy, then for the wisdom "when in Rome, do what the Romans do" should suffice.

Another liturgical principle that I have mentioned is "do what we are doing". We need everyone to do that for the best possible liturgies. We need you here before Mass begins to learn the new hymn, to hear the announcements, to quiet ourselves, to greet our neighbor, to learn our neighbor's name. We need you here from the beginning so that we can all sing the gathering hymn. We need you here at the end so that we can all sing the sending forth hymn. For the ushers, simple things like listen to and pray the petitions, don't be getting up to get the baskets to get ready to take up the collection. We're not going anywhere and we're not in a hurry.

Having said all that, there are notable exceptions. With older congregations such as ours, some people cannot stand for a long period of time. Some cannot stand at all. I have recently joined the first club. My arthritis has been affecting my right leg to the point that I cannot stand for more than 20 minutes. Consequently, as I am sure you have noticed, I have been sitting down for communion because I have to. On occasion I have preached sitting down at the presider's chair rather than my usual spots. This is not license for you to sit down unless you have to, too.

A couple people questioned if I was being lazy. One person wanted to know if I was making a statement, that lay people can distribute communion as good as the priest can. The simple answer is just arthritis and sciatica pain.

Wanting to set a good example about our unity of prayer is important to me. It pains me (no pun intended) not to stand while the rest of you are standing. But it pains me more to stand when it hurts. So, do what is right and just. Reflect our unity in our prayers, our postures and our actions. This is the unity that Jesus prayed for.

I've been doing physical therapy for the past five weeks and it doesn't seem to have helped. I had eye appointment an Wednesday to see if I can get my vision fixed after the cataract surgery fiasco. Next Tuesday I meet with my pulmonologist to get the final report to see if my shortness of breath is a lung problem or a heart problem. He'll have the results of my recent echocardiogram. Other than those things, I am in good health and great shape for 72. A couple of people asked when I can retire. Actually I could have retired at 70 and become a senior associate somewhere else. No thank you.
