

FROM DEACON DICK'S DESK...

We are all Beggars

In his homily last weekend, Father Cassian emphasized an important point: We are all beggars before the Lord. He shared a story from when he was a missionary in New York City. A homeless man approached him as he was headed to his morning holy hour. "Can you help me? I'm really hungry," said the man. After some hesitation, Cassian told him he would come back after his prayer time and get him something to eat.

Soon after starting his prayer, Cassian felt the Lord "slap him across the heart." "I can't wait, I'm hungry now," said the Lord. Cassian immediately realized that Jesus had visited him in that beggar, got up immediately, and took the man to get food.

After Mass, I shared with Father that I had a similar experience about 40 years ago. I was at the Cathedral for an interview about entering the Diaconate Formation Program. After the interview, I was waiting outside for my wife to pick me up when a homeless man approached me asking for money. I ignored him and he left. About 5 minutes later, it struck me: Here I was applying to be a deacon, and I had just told Jesus to take a hike. Unlike Father Cassian, I did not have the chance to make amends as the man had disappeared.

That memory has stayed with me all this time, and I make an effort to recognize Jesus in everyone I meet and to treat everyone as a child of God. As Father Cassian said, we are all beggars and must treat everyone with dignity. And as the letter of James says, "show no partiality."

We will be hearing from James for the next few weeks. And it's important to remember that scholars think this might be one of the earliest letters written to the Christian community, even earlier than Paul's letters.

Richard Rohr notes that this letter is all about lifestyle: How you live your life. No fancy theology, just down to earth guidance on what it means to believe in Jesus. This is a basic message that is still needed today.

Last week, the message was that we are all equal in God's sight. We are not to show partiality to the rich and famous, but to treat all people as bearing the image of God.

This week, James emphasizes the importance of your faith being manifest in your works -- What you believe and what you do. The message is that if you don't live differently, what does it matter to say you believe in Jesus? Who cares?

There are a lot of people who claim to believe in Jesus. But they are also racists, sow division and hatred, ignore the poor, demonize migrants, support capital punishment, and support war. Their belief in Jesus has not changed the way they live.

In the coming weeks, James will teach us more about how our faith and works must go together. There is no faith without works. And James will challenge us about how we are living hour to hour, day to day, week to week.

He will be asking us: "Are we like Jesus? Or are we like everyone else?" Listen and reflect on how our lives reflect what we profess. Remember, we are all beggars before the Lord.
