

FROM THE DESK OF FR DOUG...

Do Not Fear the Past

My trip to Ghana two weeks ago was powerful and emotional. Formerly known as the Gold Coast, Ghana was ground zero to the slave trade.

In 1452, Pope Nicholas V charged Alfonso of Portugal with the "Christian" duty to enslave any non-Christian. The Pope's act would be the first recorded international edict to literally grant a Christian nation the right to promote, enforce, and heavily profit from slave trading. Decades later, Pope Alexander VI beckoned Christian monarchs to conquer native populations in the name of the Catholic Church, upholding the tradition to enslave non-Christians in whatever lands they called home.

These days tourists get to see the once-luxurious suites where the European slave merchants stayed and sexually exploited female slaves. They also see the dungeons that once housed the slaves and the dingy, dimly lit corridors that lead to the "door of no return." This door is in the outer walls of the castle, facing the sea, and was so named because once slaves walked through it they never returned.

At the "door of no return" the slaves were led into boats that transferred them onto big ships farther down the sea, for the long and horrendous journey to the Americas.

In the travel book 1,000 Places to See Before You Die, Patricia Schultz writes that by the 18th century, up to 30,000 slaves passed through the "door of no return" each year. Anouk Zijlma, a Malawian travel guide, says of her visit to Elmina Castle, "You can always feel the suffering in the air, it's unsettling."

Elmina Castle—designated a World Heritage Site by the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) due to its significance—is one of many relics of slavery in Ghana and other African countries.

There is Cape Coast Castle, also in Ghana, visited in 2009 by former US President Barack Obama, his wife Michelle, and their daughters. President Obama said the site reminded him of man's potential for "great evil."

How does a country with such a sordid history deal with it? In my hotel room, there was the usual magazine that had restaurants, places to visits, events of the week etc. It also contained inspirational quotes from former UN Secretary General Kofi Annan, an article for women titled 'Why do I keep having miscarriages' and the following poem, "Do Not Fear The Past"

Do not fear the past. It is ugly but it is ours. Do not hold on to lies That you were fed when you were young.
Learn the history of your people
Find the truth to free your soul from evil. Learn the Qur-an. Learn the bible. Find the meaning of life and religion. Do not fear the past. It is painful but it is real.
Blood was spilt and people died but love and unity had survived. Learn the tongue of your ancestors. Reconnect with the roots of your blood Find the knowledge That was stolen Find the life that was robbed from us. Do not fear the past. Embrace it Let is teach you the wisdom of your race Take its lessons and live by them Own the identity that was erased. Do not fear the past, Do not hate it. Do not fear the past. Learn about it. Let is teach you. Let is nurture you. Let it remind you, of who you are. By Zuhura Seng'enge

Needless to say, they teach Critical Race Theory in Ghana.
