FROM THE DESK OF FR DOUG...

God Bless You

Every once in a while someone will ask me to bless something. It might be a statue or a medal. Sometimes people ask me to bless their car. Sometimes they want me to bless a bottle of water and make it holy water. (I'm not sure what kind of water it was before it gets blessed.) One time, someone asked me to bless their bible. I'm pretty sure the Word of God need not be blessed. This leads us to the questions, "What is a blessing and who can bless things?" Let's start with the second question first.

In our parish study of the book, *Living the Mass*, we were reminded that we all share in Christ's life. In the rite of baptism we hear, "As Christ was anointed priest, prophet and king, so may you live always as a member of his body sharing everlasting life."

One of the ways lay people share in the priest-hood of Christ is the ability to bless. This is news to so many. Yet, when you think about it, lay people bless things all the time. In grace before meals, lay people ask God to bless "us and these thy gifts which we are about to receive". When someone sneezes we say God bless you. We don't go running to find a priest to bless the person who sneezed. We do it ourselves. Parents bless their children as they tuck them into bed.

In 1984, A Book of Blessings was published by the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship. It included many texts for blessing that are to be used by both clergy and laity and suggests that the local church adapt and expand these rites. The USCCB says "We have accepted this invitation to provide a book of blessing and prayers for all Catholics in the United States to us" from the Foreward to the A Book of Blessings. Here's a sample found in the index of the Blessings for Advent and Christmas:

Blessing of an Advent wreath

Blessing of a Christmas tree

Blessing of a Christmas crèche or manger scene

Blessing for the New Year

Blessing for the Home and Household on the feast of the Epiphany.

What is a blessing? It is not superstition. It is not magical words that somehow transform something from being unholy to holy. The catechism of the Catholic Church describes a blessing this way: "Blessing expresses the basic movement of Christian prayer: it is an encounter between God and humans. In blessing, God's gift and human's acceptance of it are united in dialogue with each other. The prayer of blessing is a human's response to God's gifts: because God blesses, the human heart can in return bless the One who is the source of every blessing."#2626. Notice how a blessing really has nothing directly related to the object being blessed. It is a prayer of thanksgiving and praise to God, the source of all good.

Is this important stuff? It might seem significant, but it is not. Believing that only a priest can bless things is another vestige of clericalism. That belief grants power and control to a priest instead of where it belongs, in the laity's hands. It is a short jump to giving a priest power and control not only over blessings but over people, including children. Clericalism is the main cause of clergy sexual abuse. The effort to eradicate clericalism from our Catholic culture must and should be done away with. It is time for the laity to reclaim what is rightfully theirs, a reality that even the magisterial church teaches.
