



ROM THE DESK OF FR DOUG...

It's All Relative

So, there I was ready to come home after five days in El Salvador. It had been a nice visit with friends and Fr. Paul Schindler. The 85-degree weather was not hard to take. My hotel room had an ocean view, was only \$65 a night and included breakfast. But still, it was Katie's last week and Briyant is still learning, and I wanted to get home.

First, I got a notice on my phone that my 2:50pm flight was delayed until 4:20. About an hour later, another message came saying that it was delayed until 5:30. Then another message saying until 6:45 because they couldn't get a flight crew in time. Then another saying 10:50pm. Finally came a message saying that the flight had been cancelled. At the time, I was unaware of the ice storm in Atlanta and across the East Coast. Had I known, I would not have hoped the flight would not be cancelled.

At the same time I was getting news about my flight, I was watching news on the BBC about the fires in Los Angeles. The conflagration was international news, and it was not good. Having lived in the Highland Park neighborhood of Los Angeles, which is next to Pasadena, I was familiar with many places that were now up in smoke, especially the ones near Pasadena.

What happened to me in El Salvador was, at worst, an inconvenience. What happened to the thousands of people in Los Angeles was an unfathomable tragedy. It is difficult to imagine the degree to which places like Pacific Palisades were decimated. We all saw the pictures. It is difficult to comprehend the destruction: the loss of homes, libraries, businesses, schools, churches, temples, grocery stores and so on. How do they even begin to rebuild if they rebuild at all? It made my extended stay in El Salvador a blessing instead of an inconvenience. It's all relative.

Meanwhile, while I was enjoying the heat and the sun, Katie was running around trying to find priest substitutes at the last minute. Where is there a sub list? Fr Jack Manning wasn't available. Eventually, Fr. Bob Sanson was able to do Saturday at 4 and Fr. Lou Papes was able to do both Masses on Sunday. Both priests commented on the joy of celebrating Eucharist with our community, particularly the full, active and conscious participation of the laity.

Katie told me that Bob left before we got to the end of the last verse of the sending forth hymn and so the people didn't sing the last verse. Lou did the same on Sunday at the 11 and so we only sang three verses. Why? Well, the message is: "the Mass is about the priest" so when the priest leaves, it's over, vs the reality, "the Mass is about the community gathered in prayer. We keep singing whether the priest is there or not!" This is another example of clericalism where what the priest does dictates what happens and is more important than good liturgical practice.

This leads me to another thought. During the book discussion, Living the Mass, it was suggested that I use some homily time to talk about the liturgy, about why we do what we do and how we do it. We have had so many new parishioners over the past couple of years that may be unaware of what makes good liturgy, things that I have been emphasizing since day one. This might be a good review for the entire parish as well. I will start putting some thoughts together, but here are some: why do we sing all the verses? Why do we sing the Eucharistic prayer? Why do we stand when we do? What are those two baskets for? How can I bring up the gifts of bread and wine? When does Mass begin (there is an answer in the catechism for that!)? Why doesn't the cantor just lead the psalm from where he/she leads the singing, instead of walking all the way up to the ambo? It would save time. How come the Gospel book is carried in but not carried out?

Were you able to fill in the back page of the directory correctly? I hope so.
