

OUR MISSION STATEMENT



Sight Beyond What I See...

The last time I wrote to you all, I was introducing myself to the parish, telling you all who I am by mentioning what my values were, the academic background I had, etcetera. From that time to now, I have had the opportunity to learn from Katie before her retirement. I have also had the opportunity to spend time with you all, learn about your families, your grandchildren, and children. I appreciate everyone for making me feel at home. Your kindness is genuine and a blessing to me.

Just with any other transition, I know you are wondering what's next. What's next for the year at Blessed Trinity? Hopefully by the end of this column, you'll have a clearer picture of what the plan is for 2025 and beyond. I believe in teamwork. God created community for a reason. We are all called to work together to bring forth the kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven. Therefore, I do not plan on working to bring these things to fruition alone. I am counting on you all, the laity of Blessed Trinity, to help change the lives of those around us.

One of the things I hope we accomplish at BT is build a strong youth & family program with the focus of family discipleship through service. What would that look like? It would look like BT families coming together to serve on a service project in the summer to places like New Mexico, Kentucky, North Carolina, or Louisiana. The goal of the service project is to have families and youth work together as we spend a week in one of those locations working to build and repair houses, serve "the least of these", and build a greater bond with God and each other. I plan to launch this service project in June.

Revamping Vacation Bible School is also something I hope we can accomplish together. God is a God of variety, and with that understanding, I thought it would be beneficial to offer our youth a Vacation Bible Camp, where they will learn about and experience God through several themes that week, one theme being faith and science. I strongly believe that offering different themes for Vacation Bible Camp will strengthen the faith of the youth and add to their lifelong discipleship. BT has been long committed to the idea and action of eradicating poverty in the community. I plan to stay faithful to that allegiance by applying for Catholic-based grants that will help us to join the fight against the systemic evils of poverty. The goal of these grants is to assist us financially in educating and equipping those that have been disenfranchised and deprived of basic human rights and needs.

I am not just inviting you to take part in these different projects just for you to take part in them, but I am inviting you to freely give yourselves away, as your discipleship calls for it, to be the hands, feet, eyes, and heart of Jesus. Let us go into the year bearing good fruit by serving God through the ministry.

Operating in the call of pastoral assistant is challenging. I remember laughing with Katie one day as she was going over some things that would be part of my calling after she retires, to which I said, what have I gotten myself into? What kept me grounded in this unfamiliar territory was the understanding that God's sight is always beyond what I see, that's why I can trust where he placed me. The Holy Spirit also set in my heart a familiar spiritual adage that says, "If God leads you to the edge of a cliff and tells you to jump, he will catch you or teach you how to fly."
