

ROM THE DESK OF BRIYANT...

Turning Water into Wine...

A few weeks back during a parish staff meeting, the story of Jesus' first miracle, the miracle of turning water into wine, was read by Fr. Doug. After contemplating for a few minutes, I asked the Holy Spirit to come into my heart and grant me a fresh revelation of that miracle. Holy Spirit, I know I have read this story many times but give me a greater understanding. What is it that you want me to learn this time?

Waiting for the Spirit of God to speak back to me, I thought of how dire the situation was. During the days of Jesus, weddings were such a grand occasion and had lasted for days. It would be embarrassing for the bride and groom to run out of wine during a wedding. In addition to that, wine was crucial to the celebration and considered a symbol of joy. The bride and groom were on the cusp of embarrassment with the symbol of joy almost fading away.

As we all know, Jesus' mother came to him overwhelmed by the faith that if there was someone who could save this wedding from a disastrous end, it would be him. Jesus was the Son of God, so why not go to the source of all miracles? Jesus, hearing her request, told her that it was not his time. Immediately after telling his mother this, she orders the attendants at the wedding to obey Jesus' every word; they do. From the jars the attendants fill comes the best wine that the party has ever tasted. The wedding is saved. A good time continues to be had. Mary's faith is strengthened. The bride and groom are saved from what would have been complete humiliation. Jesus saves the day.

While thinking on all of this, I could not help but think of Mary's plea to Jesus. I also could not help but think of Jesus' response to Mary's plea. I thought of Mary as the faithful oppressed, the disenfranchised, the marginalized, as they cry out to Jesus, seeking his aid, on the tip of losing hope. Their situation is dire and requires an immediate response. What happens when these people go to Jesus to seek aid and come to the realization that it is not *time* for him to respond or tend to their crisis?

In this context, why does Jesus' sense of time and the hour override the woes of those needing his help now? How do we make sense of this timing? Is it for us to understand without finite minds? In the context of morality, shouldn't the sense of urgency and cries from the people who are at their wits end require immediate action from Jesus?

Waiting on God can be challenging because humanity's concept of time and God's divine concept of time are not the same. We oftentimes believe that God is taking too long to alleviate some of our most burdensome troubles. What are we to do with this? What are those suffering from a myriad of disparities to do with this understanding?

My limited answer on this comes from the attendants doing what they were capable of doing (filling the jars with water) while Jesus did the impossible (turning water into wine). Let us do what is humanly possible to alleviate the oppression of others, while we wait until the return of Jesus the Christ to forever eradicate suffering of all people.
