


OUR MISSION STATEMENT

A Season of Emptiness

In my opinion, one of the most challenging things to do in our walk with God and participation in the gospel of Christ, motivated by the Holy Spirit, is to give ourselves over to the practice of kenosis. Kenosis is a Greek term that means "emptying." In the context of Jesus Christ, it means that Jesus chose to empty himself. Jesus did not empty himself of his divine nature or his deity as God, but Jesus emptied himself and made himself nothing. Jesus gave up not only himself, but his privilege. He did this to serve God and man wholeheartedly. Another definition of the Greek term kenosis is called self-renunciation. Selfrenunciation is the act of giving up one's own desires and ambitions for the sake of others. Basically, self-renunciation brings about the spirit of selflessness. Jesus put the needs of others before his own. Personal gratification was not his goal in his ministry, but the salvation of others through selflessness. It was no longer about him or what he wanted to do. Self-renunciation led to Jesus being used by God to bring salvation to the world. In this, Jesus understood that through the act of kenosis, it was no longer his will, but God's will (Luke 22:42). Jesus inevitably took on the role of a servant.

In the spirit of kenosis, Jesus completely submitted himself to the will of God. Everything that Jesus did was for the glory of God and not himself. Genuine kenosis has a way of eliminating the spirit of vanity. Eliminating the spirit of vanity, Jesus in turn took on the spirit of humility by becoming man. Jesus decided that he would experience what humanity was like, go through trials and tribulations, experience the life of those who were under the spirit of oppression.

He decided to take part in humanity by laying down his life and being put to death for the love and sake of others, even when he knew they would he wouldn't love him back. Remaining in the form of God, Jesus defeated death and repaired what was once irreparable—our relationship with God. Our current political, social, and economic climate calls for us to take on a season of emptiness. Today, we are called to be like Jesus and empty ourselves. We are called to lose our lives to gain life. We are called to mirror and partake in the divine submission of Our Lord and Savior to God and to others. We are called, much like Jesus, to pray with our hearts and our feet.

When Jesus came on the scene at the beginning of his ministry, he entered at the perfect time. It was the perfect time for him to empty himself and serve as a model for humanity. He came on the scene when people were being oppressed, when people who deserved autonomy had it ripped away from them, when people were suffering and praying to God to alleviate their burdens. Jesus had become the answer to the prayers of a suffering people all because he gave his entire self, his will, his ambition, and all in exchange for the life that God had predestined for him.

In closing, we must practice emptying ourselves, daily. We all have the grace of God resting upon us to empower us to do the most challenging thing there is to do in the life of a Christian. It is most difficult to empty ourselves because human will and self-gratification are forceful and does not go away easily and without a fight. This is why we must rely on the Spirit of God to empower us everyday to empty ourselves for the sake of others and our salvation.
