



FROM THE DESK OF BRIYANT...

A Season of Emptiness

We are not strangers to difficulty, suffering, grief, pain, and struggle. In fact, our life in Christ calls for us to experience these things...sometimes more than others. We suffer for the sake of Christ. We suffer because to take part in his triumph, we must take part in his suffering. Thinking of this very poignant fact calls to mind what we all must be—suffering servants.

But how must we be suffering servants in our current socio-political-economic climate? How must we be suffering servants for a time such as this? How can we be suffering servants today? During the protest interest meeting, I asked all of those who attended to search their hearts and ask the Spirit of God whether they belonged in the ministry of protest. I said that to say that our first line of discernment about how we must take on the role of a suffering servant is to seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

We must always be dependent upon the Spirit of the Living God to show us who we are to serve. What or who has God been calling you to as of late? Who and what has God been placing on your heart? Who do you see or whose name comes to mind when you are in prayer? By discerning who and what God has called you to, you are on the right path to becoming what God required even of Christ.

Suffering servants make their mark upon the world as they act on behalf of the Holy Triune God. Suffering servants are not only in relationship with God, but they suffer on behalf of others. They are advocates for "the least of these." And because they are advocates for the outcasts and downtrodden of society, they are marked as despicable and ultimately rejected by mankind. A suffering servant must also intercede for those who are in desperate need of alleviation from their pain, suffering, struggles, and even their oppression. A suffering servant tends to pray with their heart and their feet... without ceasing because it is what they are called to do.

In Jesus' primary role as suffering servant, he chose to bore the pain, the misery, the persecution, and the grief of others, mainly those whom he served. Now, make no mistake about it, he did not have to do this, but *he chose to do this*. In this understanding, Jesus chose to lay his deistic privilege aside and engulf himself in humility for the sake of others.

Just as Jesus' functionality in the role of a suffering servant was fulfilled through various passages such as Isaiah 53, when we choose to take on the mantle of a suffering servant, we are fulfilling scripture as well. We fulfill scripture by joining Christ in his life, death, and resurrection. We partake in the life of Our Lord and Savior when we choose to suffer for the sake of others. As we choose this challenging path, we knowingly and unknowingly take part in prophecy.

Let us be encouraged to take on the function of suffering servants to "the least of these," to our enemies, to those that are going through bouts of doubt and oppression. Everyday we should be asking the Spirit of God to lead us on a path of right-eousness and solidifying our faith to continuous growth in the prophetic act of suffering servants.
