
OUR MISSION STATEMENT

🔗 FROM THE DESK OF FR DOUG...

New Life is Upon Us

Temperatures are slowly rising as a new season awaits us. That means there is a shift in activity in the parish. In other words, it's farming season here at Blessed Trinity.

For those who are unaware of our parish history, when I came here 15 years ago, the first thing I did was nothing. Well, it looked like nothing but it was not nothing. I observed, took notes, looked at how we might flourish as a new, merged parish and most importantly, asked myself "What does it mean to be a church in the city in the 21st century?" What's changed?

After a year of observation, one thing I noticed was that I saw that we had two unused baseball fields. The most activity they got was a lawnmower, using gas, polluting the air. Surely there was a better use of this land.

Around the same time, Pope Francis wrote his encyclical, Laudato Si about care for our planet and what we can do about it. We experimented with some raised beds outside the Joseph Center. Then we added 46 fruit trees as part of edible forest one. Before we expanded we tried to see if anything would grow. We planted a corn field and sure enough, even the deer were happy.

Fast forward and we have edible forest two and forty raised beds. In addition, we have an acre and a half for in-ground planting. This requires a lot of work. Many disciples have come forward to help plant, weed, water and harvest. Some of our refugees use this land to grow crops native to their own countries.

Already seeds for hollyhocks and loofah have been planted. Some have started to germinate. Daffodils, tulips, and hyacinth are bringing color to our property. The crabapple trees will soon be in bloom.

Laudato Si invites us to care for our common home. The use of our land in a responsible way is just such a response to that invitation. In this time of rising prices for food and subsidies to the Greater Cleveland Food bank, it is more imperative than ever to take advantage of the land we have, put it to good use and provide fresh fruits and vegetables to our neighborhood. Because we have more land to grow things, we want to make the most of this opportunity. There are still a few raised beds available if you'd like to grow your own tomatoes or peppers. There is in-ground land available for planting corn, zucchini, watermelons and pumpkins. There is an irrigation ditch that provides water to all the farming areas. All growing areas are now fenced in, providing protection from the hungry deer.

Sometimes I hear people lament the loss of the good old days. Where are the children that played baseball? It is difficult to adjust to new times. I remember before Vatican II, the Easter vigil was celebrated on Saturday morning at 8:00am! But what a great change Vatican II made in restoring the original intent of the Easter vigil. Change can be pleasantly surprising. I love my microwave.

One of the things I have learned from all this farming is how dependent farmers are on our weather. Two years ago, there was a frost around May 28 that killed all the plants. Last year we began planting outside by May 1 and things flourished. It hardly rained last June. I was watering almost every day. These are the noticeable effects of climate change. Lord knows what the farmers do.

This year the eighth-grade students from Birchwood will spend part of April 7th getting the soil ready for rototilling. They will be gathering loose rocks, spreading leaves and weeding. Their community service will have things ready before the annual OSU Extension gathering of community gardeners.

If you are ever looking for something to do in the parish, there is always something to do outside in the gardens. Just let me know your availability.




