



FROM THE DESK OF BRIYANT...

A Different Gospel

You know what is so moving and life-changing about the gospel of Jesus Christ? The true gospel of Jesus Christ embraces all in the world. It is morally and spiritually inclusive of all people—no matter the sin and or stance in culture. It gives a voice to the voiceless, courage to the discouraged, strength to the weak, and hope to the hopeless.

When you look deeply and intently at the true gospel of Jesus Christ, you find that there is no room for ambiguity when it comes to two things: restoration and inclusivity. These are foundational goals in Jesus' ministry that serve as a blueprint for us today. These goals outline the very purpose of Jesus and the spiritual maturation of the Holy Spirit that indwelled him.

When Jesus came into the world on a physical level, he interpreted the scriptures ethically, socially, and spiritually. He also lived the fulfillment and interpretation of scripture through his ministry. Giving life to the scriptures he interpreted; he made people upset—mainly times when he forgave the sins of people. He rubbed people the wrong way with his constant rescuing and favoring of women who worked as sex workers in those days.

Jesus was most comfortable around sinners more than he was with religious leaders built up with self-righteous indignation. He was most comfortable embracing sinners, sitting in their company, and welcoming them into a state of eternal restoration and inclusiveness. They, too, had sacred worth and had been crafted in the Image of God.

What Jesus was doing was countercultural to the society he lived in at that time. It is safe to say that with the understanding of Jesus' gospel of restoration and inclusivity of all people, we are to mirror this by breaking down all societal barriers.

Systemic barriers such as oppression, patriarchy, racism, poverty, and etcetera had no place in the kingdom of God. Because of this, Jesus went on a three-year tour of restoration to show that not only was the kingdom of God here and approaching, but he was revolutionary restoration had begun. People

were being restored to their original state before the fall

As we fight for and advocate in favor of "the least of these," we take on the role of Jesus Christ in our work to restore people back to God's original plan for us prior to the fall. Participating in the defense of people who are being oppressed or suffering from a myriad of disparities brings about a sacred social and spiritual inclusiveness. This is why we do the work and pray with our feet.

When we participate in the various outreach ministries that help us to connect with "the least of these," we are being used by God to bring the kingdom on earth as it is in heaven. All we are doing is restoring humanity to its original format designed by God.

Whenever people are willingly oppressing others, they are perpetrators of the curse of the fall, causing spiritual harm not only to those they oppress, but also themselves. But when we are fighting for the liberation of others, we become healers of society, change-agents, and free from a different gospel that has run rampant in America.
