

Witnessing through Activism

When I prayed to God sometime in January of this year, I had the urge to gather a group of interfaith congregants and leaders to go to our nation's capital in the spirit of activism and fight for the oppressed. I struggled with the idea as I pondered how much money it would take and how expensive DC was. I thought about how I was going to get people on board and get them to act at a time such as this. There were so many reasons why the sacred pilgrimage to DC would not work. I started off with 62 people and the number gradually decreased.

As these thoughts ran rampant in my mind, it was the voice and guidance of the Holy Spirit that said to me, "Keep going." I was worried about the number of people, but the Spirit of God kept telling me to "Keep going." Not sure about how we would get the money for the charter bus, the hotel rooms, food, and etcetera, facing a lot of uncertainty, and yet God was telling me persist. And so, I did. Without the slightest idea as to how all of this was going to happen, I stepped out on faith and the assurance that God would guide me even in my unbelief.

As I persisted with meetings and permits and scheduling different things, my faith increased. One of the greatest signs of faith included the support of the parishioners at Blessed Trinity as well as a few other organizations. We ended up raising over \$10k for the DC pilgrimage. One parishioner had donated \$2,500 from their retirement savings just to support the cause. Margie Pavone helped raise funds for people who were not financially able to come and join us as we prayed with our feet. One of the protestors that came along on the trip expressed her gratitude in tears. She had lost her job and had no money. She did not know how she was going to be able to make the trip. Your contributions not only helped her to reignite her passion for activism but also reignited her relationship with God on this pilgrimage. God used you to answer her prayers.

The Spirit of Immanuel rested upon the activists in DC. God was evidently with us. We were protected, nothing went wrong, no one was arrested, all went according to plan. The 95 petitions were read several times over the two days we were protesting. These petitions grabbed the attention of others. Some responded well and others did not, which was to be expected.

We were not only activists, but we were witnesses. Someone told one of us that we had given them the courage to act. I met a father and son who were Catholic and told me they wished their home parish would be more involved in activism like we were. I was at the Capitol Visitor Center when a kid waved at me and said he saw me protesting with the others. The fact is whether Congress was in session or not, people were paying attention to what God was doing through us. We witnessed and showed our fruit through our activism.

The 19 souls that decided to pray with their feet in DC had the backing and prayers of our home parish. We knew that you were praying for us and with us as we set upon this sacred pilgrimage. I am overwhelmed with the love and support as well as the time and effort that you all have put into making this protest happen. Whether you made signs, came on the pilgrimage, donated money, said a prayer, or even thought of us, I thank you and am eternally grateful for you.
