

An Open Letter to the new pope. I wrote this article twelve years ago, before Francis was elected. I changed three words, two names and added the names of two countries

Dear Pope N

Congratulations on your election. We have been praying for you since Pope Francis died. We will do so every day at Mass.

Much has been written about the task ahead of you. You have two challenges that must be addressed now. Both of your predecessors did a horrible job dealing with them. One is the Vatican bureaucracy and corruption. It is no longer a secret and must be fixed. Let's be honest. It's difficult to use the words "career diplomat" and "Jesus" in the same sentence. Maybe start there.

The other is the priest pedophile crisis. It continues to fester. In case you still have not figured it out yet, this is what must be done. It is not enough to say "I'm sorry." Lives were ruined, criminal activity (statutory rape) was aided and abetted and few in authority have paid the price.

We had a similar situation here in our country at Penn State. The president resigned, the football coach and an assistant coach were fired, financial compensation was given, therapy was offered, the criminal went to jail and voila! — no one talks about Penn State anymore. Justice was served in less than ten months. We are going on year 25. Many Catholics who still remain are hanging on by a thread because of it. If the church acted justly and swiftly like Penn State did, the crisis would be over.

As I write this, you have not been elected yet. It seems like the choices are between a pope who is more conservative or most conservative. Clearly there will be no changes in church teaching or church practice. None are expected.

Still there are some important things you can and must do. Cardinal Sandri said one of the greatest challenges facing the church was trying to win back those suffering from a "loss of faith" who had "turned their back on God" and the Church of their fathers. Please know how wrong that statement is. Turning one's back on the church is the result of the first two issues not being dealt with. It does not mean there is a loss of faith. I have received hundreds of letters from people dying to return to the Catholic Church if it becomes a model of honesty and justice again. They have great faith in Jesus Christ, but not the institution. Faith in God and faith in church structures are not the same thing. Please keep that in mind.

Another thing you can do is to do away with this secrecy thing. No doubt you're seen the problems secrecy causes with the Vatican bank, the curia, the Legionnaires, Opus Dei, etc. Openness is not an American thing. It is how Jesus lived and spoke.

Please do not ignore the power of symbol. One person can do a lot. Ghandi made salt. Rosa Parks sat in the bus. The "Unknown Rebel" stood before a row of tanks in Tiananmen Square. Call us to be a church of simplicity. Maybe you'd like to discard your papal attire and miter for something simpler. How about just a tunic and a cincture? St. Francis would like that. He was also a reformer. Maybe on a warm summer day, walk around barefoot outside. You'd be amazed at the sign value. Or maybe you wouldn't. Maybe you know that already.

Jesus went to hostile lands; Gerasene territory, Samaria, etc. Maybe if you took a walk through Syria (Gaza, Haiti) they would be afraid to bomb innocent people. Maybe if you went to Afghanistan our country would not use drones for fear of hitting you. Think of the lives you could save!

Catholics are getting well educated. They are no longer strangers to the bible. They have good ideas. There is communal wisdom. We need you to enter into dialogues with the best and the brightest of our theologians. Don't be afraid of them. Dialogue does not mean you compromise belief.

And you're never going to hear the truth if you insist that people call you "His Holiness". Can you find a title that is a little more humble?

When Catholics say that the church needs to modernize, that don't mean it needs to change is teachings. They mean it needs to use the latest knowledge and resources in which it bases its teachings. Thomas Aquinas thought the world was flat. He had no idea how babies were conceived. Grace builds on nature. Theology must be based on facts.

People will give you the benefit of the doubt for a while. Enjoy it. Smile. Make us proud to be Catholic.

During these past few weeks there has been much speculation about who is going to lead the Catholic Church. They say that even Jesus would not want the job. Remind them that Jesus has the job. He leads our church. We all just follow. You too.
